I Martin Flynt of Lincoln County and State
of Tennessee being weak in body but in perfect
mind and memory do constitute this my last
Will & Testament in the manner & form following
(Wt) I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Elizabeth the house and land which I now live on and
all the Negroes, and stock of every description
during her natural life or widowhood Except each
Child is to have a Negro about the same size as
they marry or come of age and also a line bed
and low chest and bed and furniture &c. and it
is my wish for my sons to have Negro boys
and my daughters Negro girls and if the Negroes are
not of Equal value, for them that gets them
of the lowest value to have same other property
to make them all equal.

I do also appoint Richard Flynt & John C.
Flynt Executors to the above will given under
my hand this 19th day of April 1815

& that he was at the time of signing sealing
publishing & declaring the same of sound
mind and memory where upon came Richard
Hlyst one of the executors appointed in sd
will and he gave bond and sufficient security
for executorship was admitted to qualify as an
executor of the said last will & Testament
of the said Martin Dcd. & John Clayton
was also appointed executor by said will
being a minor under the age of seventeen
years was not admitted by the Court to
qualify as an executor on account of his
minority

the waters of Aringtons Creek of Harpeth
to Charles Poole.
2nd) also I will a note on William Hickman
to me for one hundred & twenty four dollars to
Charles Poole
3rd) also one note on Kinchen Kollyman
for one hundred & twenty seven & one half dollars
to Charles Poole
4th) also all my Farming tools to Charles Poole
5th) also a Negro man willed by my Father to me
to Charles Poole. In witness whereof James
Cummins of the County of Lincoln & State
Tennessee have here unto set my hand &
seal this 15th day of Sept 1814
