due, and demands which I owe in right and conscience
to any person, or persons whatsoever in their care
and trust for my deceased as soon as may be
convenient. I then I give to my loving wife Jane my
whole and sole Estate during her natural life and widow-
-hood; and after her death an equal division to be made
among all my children. I nominate and appoint
my brother James Harris and Henry Seay my Executors
