and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of the Almighty God that gave it & my body I bequeath to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Almighty power of God; and touching such worldly estate, wherewith I have pleased God to bless me in this life, I give and devise & bequeath of the same in the following manner To my first wife & Legitimate to Hannah Rice my dear & beloved wife my personal property, wherewith I have lived during her lifetime or widowhood also property enough sold to pay all debts due then the balance left, as the land I do appoint my wife Hannah Rice and Elijah Rice my Executors. I do make this my last will and Testament in the presence of the 22nd day of May 1821
