Tennessee which land I purchased
of a certain John Wood likewise

all my estate goods or property of any descrip-
tion whatever that may remain after the above
Requisitions are fulfilled, and I hereby appoint
him sole executor after my decease. In Witness

bequeath to my beloved wife Delila Crop my wearing
mare, also two head of cows, all my clothing, of every kind
three beds and furniture, three cows and calves, four chosen
out of my flock. I also lend to my wife, two negroes
Gina & Pude, and the use of my plantation in De-
-bon County, until my daughter being of lawful age
or marrying, then my wife, to have her choice, as the
law directs, And the whole of my lands, to be divided
between my four children viz. Nancy Parham
James & Ethelridge, and one cow and calf to each
of my children. I also give my wife as much corn
and ~~corn~~ as well, serve her family, the present year
all the residue of my estate. Which sold except my
old grey horse, him I give to my old negro Sammy
should there be any money left, after paying my debts
I give it to my wife little or much. I do leave and
appoint my wife Delila Crop my executrix to
act and transact my business. In witness whereof
