IN THE name of God amen whereas I Thomas Young of the State of Tennessee Lincoln County Being in a very low state of health being in perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say principally and first of all I Recommend my Soul to the hands of God Almighty

that gave it and my body I Recommend to the earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my heirs and executors and touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with principally and first of all I will that all my debts and funeral charges be paid and secondly I will and bequeath that my beloved wife Mary Young whom I make and ordain one of my executrix of this my last will and Testament to have and to hold all my property both real and personal and to hold during her life or widowhood and have the liberty of buying and selling any part of my property for to discharge debts or for the use of my family except my land and sorrell horse saddle and bridle and all my working tools with a Iron furniture and one cow and calf which I will and bequeath to my son Daniel Young whom I make and ordain as my Executor of this my last will and Testament at the marriage or decease of his mother and thirdly I will and bequeath to my four daughters that now lives with me one feather bed and furniture and bow and calf to each and fourthly and last of all I will and bequeath the remainder of my property to my nine children William Young whom I make and ordain my Executor Elizabeth Beana Mary Beana Lemima Young Sally Young Mary Jane Young Nancy Young Daniel Young Frank Young to be equally divided amongst them all at the marriage or

hereby disallow revoke and annul all my former
will or wills by me in any wise before named
written or bequeathed ratifying this and no other to
be my last will and Testament in witness whereof
I have set my hand and affixed my seal this Eigh-
teenth day of February in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and thirteen in presence

This last will and Testament of Thomas Young

Thomas Young sign seal publish and declare this
to be his last will and Testament and that
he was at the time of signing sealing &
publishing the same of sound mind and memory
to the best of their skill and ability let it be
entered on the will Book at full length

V Andrew Buchanan being sick and weak of Body
but of sound mind & disposing memory for which
I thank God, & calling to mind the Uncertainty of

Human life & being desirous to dispose of all
such worldly substance as it hath pleased God to bless
me with that is to say 1. I give and bequeath to wife
Gonnet one third part of all my land and it to be
considered that it is in dispute if lost she is to have
my Negro boy named Daniel so long as she remains
in widow hood then to be the property of my son Secan-
den Buchanan & she is to have the disposal of
all my household furniture for to raise my children
with and as much of my personal property as my
Executors deem sufficient for to school & raise them
with the remainder to be sold. 2. I give and bequeath
to my son Secander Buchanan the remainder of my
land and it is to be considered he is to have all the land
at her death if the Land is gained if not to have the
Negro likewise my executor to let him have a horse if
he should live to raise the family and stay with them
3. When my personally property is sold I wish my
Executors to collect my debts that will be due and
pay my debts and gave my Daughters which is
Lenthy & Levecy Gincy Betty & Peggy all
Buchanans an Equal part of all the money
that remains of the said of my personal property
and it is to be considered that my Negro boy named
Daniel if the Land is not lost he is to be divided
amongst all my children Last I appoint
Samuel Buchanan my Brother & John B.
Buchanan Executors of this my last will
