

At the York, some Spring, 1 Negro Boy, I hand
saw, and drawing Knife, and some Eggs (1 Box)
plow, 1 Club &c. J. Patton Administrator
Recorded 29 November 1813

In the name of God Amen
William Crop of the County of Lincoln and
State of Tennessee, do make, and Ordain and declare
this instrument of writing, to be my last Will and
Testament, revoking all others, I am it is my
desire that all my just debts should be paid
four head of hogs, two sold four cows and pigs
all of the amounts due me I wish to be collected
and applied to pay of my debts. I am I give and
bequeath to my beloved wife Delila Crop my wearing
ward, also twelve head of geese, all my cratting, of every kind
three beds and furniture, three chairs and tables, her choice
out of my flock. I also lend to my wife, two negroes
kind of Pude, and the use of my plantation, in Davis-
son County, until my daughter marry the lawful way
or marry, then my wife, to have her third, as the
law directs, and the whole of my lands, to be divided
between my four children, viz. Nancy Powhattan
James & Ethelridge, and one cow and calf to each
of my children. I also give my wife as much corn
and pork as will serve her family, the present year
all the residue of my estate I wish sold except my
old grey horse, but I give to my old negro Sammy
should there be any money left, after paying my debts
I give it to my wife, little or much. I do here and
appoint my wife Delila Crop, my executor to
act and transact my business. In witness whereof

 the uncertainty of the period at which it may
 take place & the necessity there is for all men to have
 the affairs of this world at all times in the situation
 that he wishes them finally left I do therefore consider
 & ordain this my last will & testament as my property
 is not of sufficient value to be of great importance when
 equally divided between those who have equal claims
 I am principally desirous that my father & mother
 should be decently supported during their lives & that
 my brothers should in this mean time receive an
 Education equal to the extent of the means that
 my executors (herein after named) may have in their
 power in whom I have the most unshaken confidence
 I do therefore vest them with discretionary power
 for the above purpose & recommend to them to sell

my tract of land in Campbell County adjoining the
 town of Jacksonborough & purchase another of less
 value in the vicinity of some seminary & lay out
 the difference in negroes all my property is to be in
 discretion of my executors for the above purpose with
 out exception I have not been specific in the distrib-
 ution of the above property because I believe my ex-
 ecutors will act honestly & for the best the residue
 of my property after complying with the above direc-
 tions I wish to be divided equally among all my bro-
 thers & sisters and I do Appoint James Cumberly
 Senken Whitehead & Thomas H. Cissy executors of
 this my last will & testament & recommend to them
 to protect & advise an unfortunate family. In
