I also order and allow my wife Mary Patterson her support on the land where she lives and I also bequeath to my wife Mary for her support and also give to my daughter Elizabeth and Margaret terms head of sheep I also bequeath to Elizabeth and Margaret my daughter my two acres the black and gray more for the use of the farm and support of my four children. I also give them one bed and furniture a piece of land with all the plantation tools I also give Elizabeth and Margaret my daughter all my stock of cattle and hogs for the use of them and the children put into their care except the two barrels of my wife which shall be her own and I also give my horse and also leave to Mary my wife eleven sheep and to dispose of them as she may think proper. I likewise give to my son Alexander Patterson one bay horse and one bed and furniture and likewise I give to my son Dunkan Patterson one horse and one bed and furniture and also give my things else that yet remains not yet mentioned shall be long to Elizabeth and Margaret my daughters I also appoint my Executors and managers of my Estate Mary Patterson my wife and John Carithers John Patterson to this my last will and Testament disavowing all other wills and Testaments herebefore made allowing constituting and ordaining this to be my last will and Testament and make as witness my hand and seal this 16th day of January 1827.
