Whereas I William McMillan of the County  
of Lincoln and State of Tennessee having attained  
to a very advanced age and being admonished by a  
state of bodily infirmity that the period of my exis-  
tence is fast approaching nevertheless in the full exercise  
of that portion of reason with which nature hath  
blessed me for the purpose of quieting my heirs  
after my departure and providing for my aged spouse  
who has been a true and faithful companion through

After saying I have thought proper  
to make and declare this my last will and testament  
and I do order the several things herein mentioned  
carried into execution as soon as may be after my  
decease first I give and bequeath to my beloved son  
John McMillan one hundred and twenty three acres  
including the dwelling houses and spring and all  
other appurtenances and here delimitate in and to  
the same belonging to that mortgage and testament  
on which I now live and with all my farming im-  
-piments and other tools commonly used about  
my plantation Reserving to myself and my  
beloved wife Martha McMillan the houses and other  
out houses which we now occupy with all our  
house hold furniture during the natural life of  
either of us which may live the longest to enjoy it  
and as there are six acres yet remaining un-  
-disposed of out of the aforesaid tract of land  
in which I now live the said six acres of land  
I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife with  
all said singular the rights and properties in  
parcels and if it should so happen that the  
said Martha McMillan shall not at her death  
see cause to have the same to our son John McMillan  
then and in that case I authorize and empower  
him the said John to cause the said six acres  
to be struck off of the said tract of land  
according to its present boundary at any place  
except he may think proper to direct  
third I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife  
Martha McMillan a certain more and a certain  
-ster which I now consider as the property of  
my said wife by purchase with her own money  
but as the rules of law will blend them with  
the balance of my Estate I think proper to  
insert this article  
fourth I give and bequeath to my beloved son

John McMillan and my wife Martha McMillan  
the one half to each my stock of horses cattle and  
hogs and sheep with full and entire power to my  
said wife to dispose of them at her discretion according  
to her own free will and pleasure  
fifthly To my blood children Andrew McMillan  
William McMillan James McMillan Nancy Wright  
and her husband Jacob Wright Sally Chittwood and  
her husband Emma Chittwood Joseph McMillan Thos  
McMillan Jane Goff and her husband Jonathan  
Goff Patsy Marshall and her husband Gifford  
Marshall Polly Pinkston and her husband  
Hugh Pinkston Having all ready at the time  
of their marriage and establishment in life given  
to them my paternal blessing such other things  
as their circumstances did need and my circumstances  
permitted me to bestow I cannot now leave them  
any thing except my good will and prayer for their  
happiness through lifes journey without doing injury  
-vice to the faithful attachment and fellow affection  
of my son John through the rearing period and  
evening of life. In this testimony whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth  
day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and fifteen Signed sealed and
