and in the 2nd place I will and bequeath to Henry Taylor Jun^r the farm where I live with all its appurtenances upon the following conditions that if he the said Henry Taylor Jun^r my youngest son do furnish me and my beloved wife Mary Taylor during our natural life provide for us a comfortable living with all my milling firewood and mashing with all the necessary attendance that should be seasonably expected I will my house hold and kitchen furniture to be equally divided between my two daughters Cicinda Kincaid and Sarah English also to Sarah Kincaid also to Henry Taylor my youngest son constitution of the associate reformed church the 3rd vol Brown Dictionary my house bible and psalm book I will to George Taylor the 1st vol of Brown Dictionary also my stock of corn and hogs to be sold and equally divided among my children.
