Secondly I direct that my beloved wife hold all the property belonging to my estate during her widowhood and if she shall marry I further direct that she shall have one third of my estate and I further direct that my two children shall be well educated.

Thirdly and I do further direct that Joseph L. Sherrill, Maria S. Patterson and my beloved wife be my executors to this my last will and Testament. in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of March 1848.

I John McKinnay do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby making all wills heretofore made by me

First I give to my son Ethelred McKinnay my horse saddle bridle rifle gun and all the money that he now owes me and I further direct that when my two younger sons shall be come of the age of twenty one years that my said Elder son Ethelred McKinnay shall have one hundred and fifty dollars more out of my estate and I do further direct that the land now belonging to me lying adjoining the lands of Samuell Mcmill and others containing twenty five acres and also one other tract of land containing fifty acres adjoining the lands of John Watkins and others shall be sold to the best bidder when the said younger sons shall become of age and out of the proceeds arising from the sale of said land the said Ethelred McKinnay is to have the said sum of one hundred and fifty dollars and the balance of the proceeds of the land to be divided between the two younger sons John Newton and Henry McKinnay. and I do further direct also that my two younger sons shall have my bed and bedding and furniture and all my household and kitchen furniture and all my wearing and farming utensils of every description. And I do further direct that should either of my two younger sons viz Henry or Newton McKinnay die before they become of age that his part of my estate shall be divided between Ethelred and the other younger son and should it so happen that both the younger sons should die before they become of age that Ethelred McKinnay shall have all that belong to my estate And I do further direct that my son Ethelred McKinnay shall be the executor to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st day of April 1848.
