state of Health but knowing the uncertainty
of life and the certainty of death and being
of sound mind and disposing memory do
make ordain and publish the following
as my last will and testament hereby revoking
and making void all other & former wills
by me made

First it is my will and desire that after my
death I be buried in a plain decent and
Christian like manner and that all my just
debts & funeral expenses be paid by my executors
herein after named as speedily as possible
after my death out of any money on hand
or from the proceeds of any property herein
after directed to be sold by my said Executors.
Second I give and bequeath to my son
Benjamin H. Sharp my colt of Ocean one
Calf of his choosing my big Sow Male
I also give and bequeath to my said Son
Benjamin two of my best feather bed beds
toads of furniture my Chiny prop & furniture
that belong to it my clock also two of my best
Plow two best hoes Chopping ax also all
my tools & forming utensils of every description
together with all the residue of my house hold
& Kitchen furniture which are of little value
the most of the tools now on hand having been
purchased by my said Son with his own
money since his arrival of age.

Third I give and bequeath to my daughter
Nancy Gray one Cow & Calf with choice
after Benjamin my Mow & Buggy —
Fourth I will and direct that all the residue
of my stock of every description be sold by my

Executor as soon after my death as he may think
best and upon such time & terms as may seem
most to the interest of my estate and the proceeds
applied by my said Executor as herein after
directed Fifth, I give and desire to my son
Benjamin my tract of land I purchased
of John Branson containing about Ninety
Lies acres I also give & bequeath to him my
Negro boy Anthony John Wesley & girl named
Mary — I also give to him all notes accounts
& other claims I may have at the time of my
death out of which together with the proceeds
of the stock herein before directed to be sold
With any money I may have on hand at my
decease he is to set apart for the use and
benefit of my Grand Daughter Allie Ann
Rob. Shumell three hundred dollars which
laid amount it is my will and desire shall
remain in the hands of my said Son Benjamin
and bequeath put at interest for her sale or
& benefit until she shall arrive to the age of
Twenty one years at which time he shall pay
over to her the said three hundred dollars
With all the interest he may have received
on the same But if the said Allie Ann should
die before she shall arrive at the age of
Twenty one years then the same to be equally
divided between my daughter Nancy Gray
& my said Son Benjamin H. Sharp.

Sixth, I give and bequeath to said grand
daughter Allie Ann & Shumell one feather
bed of furniture, Seventh, I give to my daugh-
ter Nancy Gray one feather bed of furniture
also my sugar Chest small square Table I also
give to my daughter Nancy my Negro woman
Stelly my negro boy named Hartman to her

daughter Bathshea Gracy my negro girl Eliza
I also give to her one f'dethor bed & furniture
Lastly I hereby nominate Constable and
appoint my said son Benjamin H. Sharp
Executor of this my last Will & Testament

my hand & seal this nineteenth day of
February in the year of our Lord One thousand
Eight hundred & forty nine.

William Kunnen of Lincoln County State of Oregon doth make and declare this to be my last will and Testament
I will and bequeath my property both real and personal to my four
last children which I had by my two wives amelia & Polly
I will that my property remain undivided for the sum of five years
from any, decease and remain in possession of Samuel D.
Buchanan provided he live on my farm and works the
same and takes care of the family for which he is to receive
a proper compensation for his trouble to be agreed
upon between him and my executors if at any period
of the time of five above mentioned my executors should
deem it proper to have my property taken from the
possession of S. D. Buchanan and sold they have the power
to do so & give to my two grand children William
A. Sharp and Francis E. Sharp one hundred dollars
each provided at my decease I hold the amt. I am
in possession of at this time and if my property dimin-
ishes in value they are to suffer a corresponding
and diminution in the above legacy to be determined
by my executors to be paid to them when they become
of age without interest I give to my son Elmer
H. Kunnen a horse and saddle worth one hundred dollars
the same to my son Ellsworth H. Kunnen a horse and
saddle worth one hundred dollars to Samuel D. Ringold
a horse and saddle worth seventy dollars a cow
calf bed & furniture worth forty dollars at the division of
my estate the above amounts to be taken from their respect-
ive shares I hereby appoint Charles Whiting and John G.
Whiting Executors to this will signed sealed and delivered
in the presence of us this 18 day of August 1839
