debts and Eight hundred dollars as directed
in this my last will the balance together with
the Negro Man Bill as before mentioned to be
Equally divided between Eliza (McClain) her
Mary Gregory and her heirs William (McClain)
and Joseph (McClain) It is my will and my wish
that the Negro Man Bill be sold on a credit
of twelve months to the highest bidder I want
Eliza (McClain) her to have one fourth Mary
Gregory and her heirs one fourth William
McClain one fourth by him accounting for
one hundred and fifty dollars which I paid
him and Joseph (McClain) one fourth
eventhly I give and bequeath to Mrs Sarah
McClain two youngest daughter Maria Thompson
McClain and Sarah Elizabeth Milson (McClain)
my Negro Man Granville (at this time hired to
Henry Kelso) to be Equally interested in said
Negro Man I also give and bequeath to them
two beds and furniture and my Chest.
Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint John
McClain and John Clark Jr. my Executors In
witness where of I do to this my will set my hand
and seal this the 20th July 1850.

Whereas I Andrew M. Walker Being in my proper
And right Reasonable Mind Have thought
proper to make Constitute and Ordain this
my last will and Testament
(To Wit)

Then the first— My will and desire is that all
my just debts be paid in the first place
Then the second— My desire and wish is that my
wife Elizabeth Walker hold and possess all
my landed Estate (To Wit) the tract of land
now live up containing One hundred and
nineteen acres more or less also the present
Crop of Corn belonging to the same also
two other small tracts of land situated and
lying over the Creek on the Ridge One
containing twenty four acres the other
contains twenty acres more or less and
lies joining together bounded on the North
by the Widow Roundtree's land on the East
by Joseph Long's on the South by William
Brown's land and on the West by L. H. H. H.
and David Roughton's land Together with
all the improvements improvements or in any
wise appertaining to the same and all the
household and Kitchen furniture also
the farming tools and all the Stock of
every description what ever thereunto belong
or be any way thereunto appertaining also
my two Negro Boys Perry and Emory the
property my wife Elizabeth is to hold and
possess during her natural life or she
remains my Widow. But in case or
provided she should Marry she thereby forfeit

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all her Right Title and Claims to said
Downy (Whatever except one feather Bed
and Furniture and Five Dollars in Money
(the third) I give and bequeath to my Son
John F. Walker Five dollars America Green
Walker Five dollar Columbia Walker Five
dollar to be paid to each of them when they
become of proper age to receive the same
(the fourth) I give and bequeath to my
daughter Polly Anthony Five Children
to wit To Caroline Anthony Five dollars
Andrew M. Anthony Five dollars To
Jacob Anthony Five To George M. A.
Anthony Five dollars To Elizabeth M.
Anthony Five dollars To be paid over to
them as they arrive at a proper age to
receive it. I give and bequeath to all
the rest of Children (to wit) Cincinnati
Edgar Maria Walker Peggy or Margaret
William Laurot Walker Emily Walker
Thompson Walker and Nancy Walker each
an Equal share of my Estate, also Harriet
Walker to have an Equal share with the
rest of my Children In case my Wife
Elizabeth should decess before Nancy Walker
my youngest Child becomes of age I desire
that all my Children that is not left home or
married and left and gone to their selus
should continue and live together untill
she should become of age If it should
happen that you do not wish to continue to
live together in the way I have preferred In
such an event I want my Executors to sell every
piece of Property blanging to my Estate and
divide equally to this my last will and Testament
Lastly I appoint and constitute Elizabeth

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Walker & Jas M. Walker my Executors
& Executor June 18th 1840.

A. Codicil to the before Testament
or Will (which this intended to be apart
of it) I give and bequeath to my wife
Elizabeth A Negro Girl named Mary about
twelve years old - I also give to my wife
Elizabeth my Negro Man named Sampson
about 17 years old which Negro Man
Sampson I bought of Chesa Mammae
and give him the opportunity of
redeming and in case said Mammae
does redeem him I give the money to
my wife Elizabeth to purchase her and
Negro to gether with all the before
mentioned property of all sorts and kinds
Whatever I give to my wife Elizabeth
Walker during her natural life or as
long as she remains my Widow as before
mentioned I also give to my wife Elizabeth
One Negro Boy named Arch nine or
ten years old also one Negro Boy named
Rufus Five years old this and all other
property which I may have in possession
at my decess or death and the money
I have in hand or in any way due me
by note or account Whatever I also give
to my wife Elizabeth one Negro Woman
named Minny about twenty three or
four years old and one Boy Child named
Silas.

of Sampson it is my desire that this Child
be attached to and constitute a part of
my will to all intents and purposes, And
I do hereby constitute and appoint my

Ambrose L. Parkes Executor to this my
last will and Testament this the
3^d of August 1850.

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I James A Buchanan of the County of Lincoln
+ State of Tennessee being weak of body but
of sound mind and disposing memory do
make and publish this my last will and
Testament First I bequeath my soul to God
who gave it. Second I direct that all my just
debts + funeral expenses be paid out of my
monies that I may now possess of 3^d I give
to my brother David S. Buchanan all of my
wearing apparel + sword and one half of
my Books, and the other half if my book I gave
to my cousin John M. Smith they to divide them
equally between them as they may see proper.

4th I give to my well loved Aunt Patsy (wife
of Alfred Smith) for her kind and motherly
attention to me in my sickness my Buggy + harness

5th I give to my Uncle Alfred Smith my saddle

6th I give to my two beloved Sisters Amanda
and Minerva A Buchanan to be equally
divided between them the balance of my

estate of every description consisting in the
principal part of one tract on my Uncle
Alfred Smith for nine hundred + fifty
two dollars and I also give to them (my said
sisters) all that portion of my Father James
Buchanan's Estate both real and personal

(which I might have been entitled to be
equally divided between them as first stated)

7th I nominate and appoint my Uncle Alfred
Smith my executor to this my last will and
Testament believing that he will have the
same honestly executed herein under my hand
+ seal this the 3^d day of August 1850
