Wm B Satherwood's Last Will.

I Wm B Satherwood do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made.

First, I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may be possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my executor.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my wife Sally Satherwood during her life, my negro boy Charlie, my negro woman Jane, my negro boy Sam and my negro girl Betty. I also give her during life, all my land, with the proceeds of my son Elihu to live on it. I give her my mare Boney and one other horse which she may choose. I give her all my household furniture of every description whatever. I give her my wagon and as many of my farming tools and stores as she wishes to keep. I give her as many kitchen utensils as she may choose to keep. I give her my loom. I give her as much of my stock of every description as she chooses to keep.

I give her many crop of corn & fodder.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my son John Satherwood to my daughter Satherwood, and to my son John Satherwood each two hundred dollars.

Fourthly, I give to my son Wm Satherwood two hundred dollars.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint Wm Satherwood my executor. In witness whereof I do to this my last will set my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of October eighth hundred and forty three

Art 4 At the expiration of seven years to come I
that my land in toto and all my affects what
soever after all my just debts are paid be
equally divided between my several children
and Grand child Charlotte Mourning with the
exception that my two daughters Mary Eliza
& Louisa Jane have each a horse worth fifty
dollars fifteen dollars worth of cattle ten head
of sheep bed and furniture and every thing
that they may make by their own industry
during the said seven years more than the
rest of my heirs and also that thirty three doll
ars each be taken from the shears of my son
John and Abram making in all sixty six doll
ars and be given to my Grand child Charlotte
Mourning.

Art I will and request that my friend James
Thompson be and is hereby appointed my
executor to this my last will and testament
and that the said executor take the money
or property of my Grand child Charlotte Mann-
ing and to do the best he can with it until
she arrives at the age of twenty one years
of age when she will be the legitimate owner

my seal this the 20th day of February in the
year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty
four
