

I, Anthony Bails do make and publish this my last will and testament nothing due making void all other wills made by me heretofore. 1st my desire is that my funeral expenses and all my just debts may be paid out of any money that may first come into the hands of my executors 2nd I give to my wife, Catherine Bails all the land I now possess or of any my wish and desire is that my son Alexander Bails move and live in the house with her for the purpose of assisting to paying my debts and helping his mother to take care of the children I have in possession of my said wife all of my property of every description except such as is hereafter named: 3rd I give to my son Alexander Bails one hundred horse and saddle, bed and furniture worth \$100 which he has already rec^d: 4th I give to my son George Bails one horse and saddle bed and furniture worth one hundred dollars which he has already received: 5th I give to my daughter Mary Brady forty one dollars in a bed and furniture, cow and calf, (cattle), which she has received: 6th I give to my son Anthony Bails one hundred dollars and property horse and saddle: 7th I give to my son Noah Bails one hundred dollars in a horse and saddle bed and furniture when he arrives at full lawful age 8th I give to my son Jasper Bails one hundred dollars in a horse and saddle bed and furniture when he arrives at full age 9th I give to my daughter Jane Bails forty one dollars in a bed and furniture cow and calf & to be valued to her by my executors 10th I give to my daughter Emily Bails forty one dollars in a bed and furniture cow & when she arrives at lawful age as avaries - 11th, my w^{ill} is at the death of my wife that the balance of my property if any together with my land be sold by my executors my land sold on a credit of one, two and three years and the money equally divided among all my children first making my youngest son equal with them that has rec^d: and likewise my youngest daughter equal with the daughter that has received

12th My desire is that Isaac Peabody and my son Alexander Bails be my executors to this my last will and testament - Signed Sealed and acknowledged in the presence of us on the 1st July 1845.

I, Ephraim King being in a low state of health but of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make this my last will and testament, hereby making void all other wills by me made at any time.

First: I direct direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may be possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executors

Secondly - My will and desire is that my wife Sarah King have all my property that I may die possessed of during her natural life or widowhood

Thirdly - My will and desire is that Martha A. King, Sarah A. King, Eliza W. Loring, Ephraim C. King and Washington A. King have each a horse, bridle and saddle, cow and calf, bed & furniture, and after her death death my will is that all the balance of my real and personal estate be sold, and the money be equally divided between my heirs

4th and lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Samuel H. King and James B. Hudson my executors to see that my will be carried into effect In witness I do to this my will at my home and seal this 10th day of January 1845 -

I Benjamin Knowles of the County of Lincoln and State of
Massachusetts being old and infirm and in law state of health but
of sound mind do this day make and ordain this my last
will and testament

1st I consign my body to the earth to be buried in a decent &
Christianlike manner and my soul to God who gave it and
in relation to my earthly property it is my will that it
should be left to my beloved wife and children in the follow-
ing manner after my executors shall make sale of so much
of my perishable property as may be necessary to defray the
expenses of my funeral and discharge all the just debts which
I may in any way owing to any person or persons whatever
2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann Knowles
to be hers for the use of herself and for the support of
my two daughters now living with us while said daugh-
ters shall remain single and are desirous to live
peaceably with their mother all and singular my
lands and tenements household and Kitchen fur-
niture one horse of her own choosing all cattle all
my hogs and sheep and of any stock or article
which may not be herein mentioned after the sale
of my executors as above mentioned to her and
to the only proper use of her during her
natural life or widowhood and at her death
said lands and tenements to be disposed of
in the following manner

3rd To wit I give and bequeath unto my two daughters
Martha Knowles and Elizabeth Knowles all the lands
and tenements above mentioned to be equally divided
between them to be theirs and to their only proper use
for themselves and their heirs forever.

4th I give and bequeath to my eldest son Essed Knowles
one dollar out of my estate when collected by my
executors over and above what he has heretofore
received of me in token of the love I bear to
him 5th I give and bequeath to my eldest
daughter Rebecca wife of Joseph Campbell one
dollar if she is living to be paid by my said
executors out of my estate over and above the prop-
erty she has heretofore received of me in testimony
of the love I have for her

6th I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Soney wife of William Thompson one dollar to be
paid by my executors out of my estate when col-
lected over and above the bed and furniture
which she received of me when she was first mar-
ried and left my house in testimony of the
love I have for her

7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary wife
of Philetus one cow and half or other property
of the stock in the farm to the amount of ten
dollars which property shall be paid by my
executors to said Mary Philetus previous to the
sale above mentioned in testimony of my love to her

8th I give and bequeath to my daughter Cynthia wife
of Matthew W. Carter ten dollars to be raised out
of my estate and paid over to her in place of the
land which I sold to Matthew Knowles out of his
share of the said land

9th I appoint and ordain my two Trusty Friends
Ezra Cofford Carter and my son Matthew Knowles
executors of this my last will and testament
