In the name of God Amen I Matthew Price of Lincoln County State of Tennessee becoming old and infirm but being of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all my worldly substance as I have been please God to bless me with my will and wish is that when I please God to take me from this world that my body shall be interred in the earth in a decent and Christian like manner.

I first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Price the benefit and use of all my land negroes and all other property that I may be in possession of during her natural life or widowhood after making sale of perishable property sufficient to pay all debts that I may owe and after the death of my wife Elizabeth my will and wish is that all my property and possessions both real and personal shall be sold by my Executor. And I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anna Brown my daughter if living if not to her children two hundred and twenty five dollars and also unto my daughter Sarah Hamilton if living if not to her children two hundred and twenty five dollars and what may remain to be equally divided between my four children (to wit) Anna Brown, George Price, Sarah Hamilton & John Price. Price for forty dollars due Decr 1843 one on David Selpe for about twelve dollars and all my right and title in the tract of land that I am entitled to by descent on which she now lives also the money I am entitled to in the hands of Jesse Price my Guardian, And will appoint my Mother Mary Price my Executrix to settle and wind up my business in testimony whereof I have hereunto signed my hand and seal to be affixed in the presence of three witnesses this the 9th day of Sept in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three

C. and Robert A. Cushman or any other

which my wife Elizabeth may have by me

Finally, I will that often my estate be equally divided between my Children my wife Elizabeth sister, that my estate be equally divided between my Children, that may then be living, but if she should marry again, I will that she have an equal part with my Children of all of my estate, and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint William H. Grooman Executor with my wife Elizabeth Co. Executor to this will, In witness whereof I at to this my will set my hand & seal This 26th June 1843.

Kindly. I give and bequeath to my son John Lathrop
to my daughter Lathrop, and to my son Eliza Lathrop
each two hundred dollars.

Heartily, I give to my son Mervin Sutherland two hundred dollars.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint Morris
Lathrop my executor - In witness whereof I do to this
my last sit my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of
October eighteen hundred and eighty three
