First I gave to my two sons John and Joseph Thompson each one hundred and twenty dollars to make them equal with my son Henry Harman for a certain parcel house which he took with him when he left this County which I consider worth that amount and lastly that My Negro man Jackson to go then with the remainder of my household and kitchen furniture stock provisions &c after my ^{wife's} death selection be sold as soon as convenient after my death and the land and negro woman Ann and together with that portion of household & kitchen furniture stock that be living to be sold after the death of my wife and equally distributed between my three sons John Henry Harman and Joseph Thompson And I do hereby appoint my son John Landels to execute and carry into effect this my last will and Testament
