I Isaac Galtis of the state of Newfoun and County of Lincoln being at this time weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament working etc other and as touching what worldly estate it has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in the following (viz)

1<sup>st</sup> My will and desire is that the fifth acre tract of land I purchased of William Braden be sold on a credit of twelve months and the money thereon arising to help pay my just debts.

2<sup>nd</sup> My will and desire is that my three youngest sons to wit Newton, James and Thomas have the sole use and

benefit of the balance of my land and premises until James and Thomas become of lawful age and at that time said land to be equally divided according to quantity and quality between my five following sons viz William, Nelson, Newton, James and Thomas.

3<sup>rd</sup> My will and desire is that my two sons James and Thomas have two colts which they have claimed and given to have a saddle worth twenty five dollars Thomas having already had his saddle, now each two sheep apiece and the hogs they have marked in their own mark all three of them a plow and gear, each James and Thomas also to have the cooking utensils and cupboard ware and a year provisions to be left off to them by John Braden him and James W. Holman and moreover that Nelson James and Thomas have feather bed and furniture.

4<sup>th</sup> My will and desire is that my four following daughters Sophia, Polly, Eliza and Julietta have two sheep each and Elizabeth to have a cow.

5<sup>th</sup> My will and desire that my horse called Jack and my mare called Pigeon be left with Thomas and James until they become of lawful age and Elizabeth is to have a colt from the mare if they can raise one and at that time the balance of the horses with the increase that may be left be thrown into the estate for a general division amongst my daughters.

6<sup>th</sup> My will and desire is that whereas my son-in-law E. Hartbaugh has taken a lease of my land has been in possession of it one year my desire is that he have said lease four years longer.

7<sup>th</sup> My will and desire is that all my property of every description not mentioned in this will and that what is mentioned to be sold when Thomas and James become of lawful age be sold on a credit of twelve months and the money thereon arising after finishing paying my just debts be equally divided between my nine daughters (viz) Jane Chapman, Elizabeth Cashier, Sarah Brown, Nancy Galtis, Sophia Lang

Martha Brady and Polly Marbrough, Eliza Allen, and Julian Brady. The balance of the property left except what is left unto Thomas and James to be sold immediately the other to be sold when the become of lawfull age.

And lastly my will and desire that my son William Gatti and my son in law Abner Brady be Executors to this my last will and testament believing they will see it properly executed.

### John Poyor Son's Last Will

In the name of God Amen I John Poyor Am of the County of Lincoln  
and State of Tennessee being quite unable and weak in body but sound  
in mind and know know that it is appointed for all men to die and  
maching to dispose of what worldly goods it hath pleased God to blesse  
me with I do make publish and declare this to be my last will and  
testament - first I wish all my just debts to be paid by my executors  
as early after my decease as is convenient My daughter Mildred  
in her lifetime received what I intended for her except the value  
of two negro boys Peter and Henry which is with my sons John and Steve  
I wish the two boys valued at cash valuation and the amount  
equally divided between Mildred's two daughters

I have also given my son William what I wish him to have at  
present - My son John has also received what I wish him to have  
at present except a negro girl Martha which is his - My daughter  
Ann has not received her part of my negroes which I wish her to have  
they are Shelia and her children and Anthony and Clarissa and  
also two cows and calves two beds and furniture and such other  
articles as will be necessary for house keeping also a good saddle  
horse with three thousand dollars the first of January next  
to make her portion equal with my other children

My son Nathan has also received what I wish him to have  
at present My daughter Mary has also received what I wish  
her to have at present

I wish my beloved wife Mary Poyor after my death to have  
the full use of all my negroes that I have not given to my children  
with the use of all my farm and houses and house hold and other  
furniture with the stock of all kinds farming tools with all my  
notes and cash so long as she may live and after her death all
