I desire my wife to enjoy all my property as long as she lives or remains in good credit but if she marries or forfeits her credit then I want whatever part of my estate should be left or at her death I desire all my property to be disposed of in the following manner I desire my son Aaron to have 12 months schooling or all my surviving sons then I desire all my property to be equally divided among my children. I desire my brother Isaac M'Clure to see to the care of my family & to be paid for his services.
