In the name of God amen I Jack N. Leftwich of the County of Lincoln & State of Indiana being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make ordinance and publish this as my Last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all other wills by me at any time made First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of any money I may die possessed of or out of any that may first come into the hands of my executors devising to give together with my black wife Jane during her natural life or widowhood my negro George together with the following described tract of land to wit beginning at the southwest corner of my original 209 acre tract purchased from William Pittman running thence north 129 poles with the section line to a line in Jacob Russells line thence west with my original line to the end of W. Russells line thence north to A. G. Gillis line thence west to the top of the hill to A. G. Gillis line thence south to my original tract thence west to a bark at A. G. Gillis gate on the branch therefrom the branch with its ramifications until a due course met there the north & south fence near Gramys and east of the line running to the other down the creek with L. W. Leftwich to the fountain spring thence with the creek to opposite L. W. Leftwich house thence to the

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out of W.M. Whitmans meadow thence northward to a stake in my field thence eastward to a rock corner near W.M. Whitmans gate thence north to a rock corner thence west to the beginning. Also a tract of land bounded to certain fifty acres begining at a back tree near A.G. Bills gate thence west with said Bills line far enough to run due south & leave the Spout Spring on the west side of the line thence with the meanderings of the branch to the creek thence with the meanderings of the creek to the south west corner of the dover thence north with the dovers line to the begining also 10 acres of land for timber out of the south west corner of a 44 acre tract purchased from Samuel Garland & lying and adjoining the lands of Alexander Gile. Thirdly I bequeath unto my said wife all my household & kitchen furniture farming utensils over may for two horses 16 months three cows and calves and a sufficient quantity of corn pork meat oats hay & fodder for the next years services all my stock hogs & horthby my will and desire is that my son L.B. Saffrich live on the dover with his mother and take care of the farm and stock and out of the profits of the same she shall have a sufficient and ample trust sufficient so as to enable her to live easy and comfortably, any balance that may occur shall belong to my said son and in case a separation should take place between my wife and son for any cause my son shall have all the lands lying east of the branch east of the house and an equal division between them of the stock in same farming utensils and services until the death of my wife and after her death my said son shall have full possession of all the dover except the 87 acre tract and have the

same him and his heirs and assigns forever except about one acre and a half around the meeting house bounded by the branches on the east west on the south by the spring or the north by my back fence which I give to the church for their use as long as long as they may continue to meet there for the purposes of worship and also after the death of my wife my said son L.B. Saffrich shall have all the stock that they may have on hand all the farming utensils and I further direct that all my lands not wanted in the dover shall be sold about the first of November 1808 in three lots or a credit of one thousand dollars in equal instalments the tract on which my son L.B. Saffrich now lives in even lot the Alexander Gile lot in one other with 20 acres added to it from the 44 acre Garland tract the ridge tract with options of my original tract added to it and also the flock hogs mules and horses and the sheep that may be in hand on a credit of 12 months and I also authorize and direct my executors to sell my negro boy Samuel at the same time on 12 months credit they shall first confine his sale to the family and if none of them will buy him they may sell him for what at what they may deem a fair price taking a pledge from the purchaser that he shall not be sold to a trader and carried out of this section of country against his will if he conducts well land & cotton credit that the proceeds of this sale to be applied first to the payment of my debts & the balance to be divided amongst all my heirs except my son L.B. Saffrich so as to make each of my children an equal amount

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Ten to each the amount that I have heretofore advanced to them which is as follows To my daughter Nancy Bryant Rebecca & Gill each \$2.  
Rever Catharine & stone Sarah Jane each \$2  
Nancy Gill three hundred dollars each to  
Linda Wm Bryant Eighty Dollars to Martha Ann Siftwick twenty four dollars and I direct that my daughter Martha be Schooled clothes and found according to what has been custom ary in my family free of charge to her and at the expense of my estate until she comes of age or marries

Fifth I direct that after the decease of my wife the 50 acre tract of Land attached to the dower and remainder of the 44 acre Garland tract added to it and the negro boys George and John household and Kitchen furniture to be sold as near upon as near upon the principles of the first sale as practible and the proceeds equally divided amongst all my heirs with the exception of my son L W Siftwick

Sixth whereas my son L W Siftwick has undertaken to raise Patrick Durdum and obligate himself to school him and give him a horse saddle and bridle and a suit of clothes my will is that my Estate shall be charged with the above articles and allotted to my said Son in the second division of my Estate and I further direct that in case my negro boy George should die then a hand shall be hired in his place until the year 1852 and paid for out of the amount arising from the second ~~division~~ sale

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Seventh Whereas I have raised my Grandson Wm W Bryant my desire is that he shall remain with my wife until he comes of age and if he should not so remain then my will is that the amount of a years wages shall be deducted from his share of my estate.

Eighth I hereby direct that my wife shall manage until the first sale and the money arising from the sale of Oak logs or other property that may be seen shall after paying family expenses be applied to the payment of Weston Bryant's claim that is now due and other neighborhood debts and Lastly I do nominate and appoint my wife Jane Siftwick and my son L W Siftwick and Lewis Person and Paul Reed executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of June Eighteen hundred and forty four A.D.
