Jacob Pruett's last will.

I Jacob Pruett knowing that to shew to die sooner or later being very low in bodily health but sound in mind and memory, wishing to leave my worldly goods and chattels as follows. I leave to my lawful and loving wife Nancy the plantation on which I now ^{live} on containing four hundred acres of land. I also leave to her five negroes Kelly and her son Henry, and a young negro man by the name of Sam.

a girl by the name of Silvey, a boy by the name of Sam. I also leave to her all my house hold and kitchen furniture, and stock of all kind, that is to say horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, her natural life and then she all to be sold and the money to be equally divided among her children except she should marry, then all to be sold as is named above. I also leave to my son James the plantation on which he now lives five years, and then to be sold and the money equally divided among said children. I also leave my negro woman Luck and her five children to be sold and the money to be equally divided among my first wife's children. Reuben & Lewis to be sold and the money to be equally divided among my last wife's children. And this being my last will and testament, I also leave my wife Nancy and my son James A. Pruett as executor of said estate this 4th month day of April one thousand eight hundred twenty eight. Jacob Pruett
