

Ezekiel Morris's last will.

In the name of God amen.

I Ezekiel Morris of the County of Lincoln
State of Tennessee being of sound mind & memory do
make and ordain this my last will & testament in
manner following (viz)

First after my decease I require my executors
to pay all my just debts out of money out of money
owing or that may be on hand.

Second I give unto my son John M. Morris
all that part of the tract of land whereon I now live
lying west of Morris's Creek and south west of the
town of Fayetteville supposed to contain one hun-
dred & twenty acres. Also one negro boy named Daniel
also my former articles, horse bridle & saddle, and
one Cow & Calf, likewise bed & furniture.

Third I give unto my son Harvey Morris all
that part of my land lying on the east of Morris's Creek
supposed to contain nearly five acres, to be placed in
the hands of a suitable Guardian for his use, to be given
up to him when thought capable of taking care of the
same. also Bed & furniture.

Fourth I give unto my daughter Cynthia Morris
forty two half acres of land lying in the north west
corner of the tract I now live on binding on the north
boundary line. also one negro girl named Sophia
Bed and furniture and board.

Fifth I give unto my daughter Minerva forty and
one half acres of land lying south of the land that I
have in this will given to my daughter Cynthia to be
placed in the hands of my sons William & John M. Morris
for her use to be kept in their possession until they may
think proper to give her the management of the same.

Sixth I give unto my daughter Emily, one
negro girl named Maria; also one thousand dollars

to be paid out of money owing me by my son
William Morris Bed & furniture & Escutcheon.

Seventh I stell all that part of my estate not
disposed of in this my will to be equally divided
between my children. That part falling to my da-
ughter Minerva to be placed in the hands of my son
William & John Morris for her use & benefit to be sur-
rendered to her when they may think proper.

And I do hereby nominate & appoint my friends
Francis Parkfield Esq & Thomas Clarke Esq Ex-
ecutors of this my last will & testament.

James Walker's last Will.

KNOW all men by these presents that I James Wal-
ker of the state of Tennessee & County of Lincoln do
make and ordain this to be my last will and testament
in manner & form following, to wit. First I leave
in the possession of my wife Nancy the whole of my

estate consisting of negroes, horses, cattle, & household furniture during her natural life or widowhood; and at her death or second marriage, the whole of the property to be taken & sold by my Executor, and the money thereon arising put to interest and my son Carter to have the interest of said money during his natural life and at his death to be divided in the following form fourt, Polly Lewis my daughter to have one death part. My son Andrew Walker one death part. My Grandson Franklin Walker one sixth part. My Grand Children Adeline Butler & Franklin Butler my sons Walker one tenth part. And that my Daughter Millie's legal heirs have one death part. And my will & desire is that the heirs she has by Drury M. Connally may be made equal to her heirs by James Pearson taking in what their Father left them. And that my Grand son John Ford have one dollar and my Grand daughter Bridget Kirkpatrick have one dollar, these two grand children having had their share of my estate previous to this time. And lastly I constitute and appoint my son James Walker my friend Abner and my Executors to see this my last will & testament executed. Nov 28. 1828

Joel Brule's Last Will.

After her death I leave my lands to my two youngest sons Ronald & Joel to be equally divided between them both.

Item. My negroes and all my personal property I leave to be equally divided among my other children Morality, Sally & Abby after the death of my wife Sally.

I appoint Stephen Heightower to be executors of this my last will and testament. witness my hand and seal this 2^d of January eighteen hundred and twenty nine
