 Henry Martha Hornsby Sarah Hughes Isaac Grizzard
 & Betty Polk to be equally & Equitably divided
 among them - and I do hereby appoint John P. Whit
 aben and Wiley Grizzard my executors of this my
 last will & testament. In testimony whereof I have

 day of November in the year of our Lord one
 Thousand ^{Eight hundred} & forty six

John Hendersons Last Will & Testament.

In the name of God amen I John Henderson do
 make and ordain this my last will and testament
 revoking all others made by me -
 Last I do give and bequeath to my loving wife my house
 together with the land which I have generally culti
 vated during her natural life also my negro man
 by George Alfred Lucy and her youngest child Mar
 tha during her life I give her all my stock of
 every description that she may choose to keep
 also all my household and Kitchen furniture to be
 divided as she thinks proper - To my Daughter
 Mary I give the following described Land beginning
 at the Church running West with the orchard
 fence to the upper corner thence straight to her
 old line not to intrude on John L Hendersons
 all my land South East of said line to be hers
 her lifetime and to be her children I also
 give her my negro man George to my son John
 L I give all my land North West of said
 line by his paying to James W Henderson two
 hundred & Fifty Dollars to be paid twelve months after the
 death of my widow = I also give my son
 John L My negro boy Alfred I give to the
 above named heirs of J W Henderson the
 proceeds of the following property Aaron & Harriet
 to be sold in twelve months credit by the
 Executor and after the death of my widow
 Lucy & Martha and all the other property to
 be sold and Equally divided between Mary
 John L Henderson and James W Henderson
 Heirs I will that enough of my crop &
 stock be sold to pay all my just debts
 and my widow to have all the balance

That she may choose to keep Lastly I do
appoint and nominate my son John Esco
to this my test will and testament also it is
further my will and desire that John L. Hen-
derson be Guardian for my son James or
Henderson Heirs. Witness my hand and seal
this 5th September 1846.
