I do constitute and appoint my Son in Law Jacob Dwyer executor of this my Last will and Testament (witness my hand & seal this 13th day of June 1844

I Joshua Corning of the County of Lewis and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and perfect memory blessed be God do this 3rd June 1842 make and publish this my last will and Testament That is to say,

1st I give and bequeath my Soul to God who grants it and my body to be buried in Christian like manner without any pomp or parade.

2^d I give unto my loving wife Mary Corning during her natural life one fourth part of the Land that I now live on including all my present building and after her death to my Son Joshua Corning

3^d I give unto my Sons Samuel and William Donate a tract of Land that I purchased of Berry J. Don and an entry joining it exclusive of any minerals in said tract of Land which if discovered and any profits arise therefrom I wish to be equally divided between my Sons Samuel & William Donate.

4th I give unto my Daughter Eliza a tract of Land that I bought of Asa Croft White also another tract of Land that I bought of Berry J. Don joining it both containing Eight two acres.

5th I give unto my Son Nathaniel one fourth part of the Land that I am now living on which is to be taken off at the South Side including the houses that I give to Lot Lightly and Lebbos.

6th I give unto my Sons John and James Porter the other half of the Land that I am now living on to be equally divided between them.

7th I give unto my daughter Eliza and Samuels as much money as the property now worth that I give to my daughter Eliza and which sum of money to be made of the profits arising from the farms and land that I now own

of debt if not I want an equal part to be taken
from all the other shares to make the above
sums of money for my daughter Eliza and Saml
P. I nominate and appoint my sons Samuel

I John Crawford of the County of Lincoln in the State of Tennessee
being in good health and of sound mind and memory do make
& publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and
making void all other wills by me at any time made to wit
first I bequeath my soul unto almighty God who gave it
secondly I direct that at my death that my farm and all
that pertains to it my dwelling house and in general all
my property except such as shall be otherwise disposed
of shall pass unto the hands of my wife Eliza to be
by her possessed and enjoyed during the time of her natural
life it is my will and desire that the farm and plantation
shall be managed and directed by her with the assistance
of my two sons John and Ezekiel who shall share in the
crop and produce of the farm in proportion to their
assistance they render in the same manner as they
may have done during my lifetime I further direct
that in order to enable them to carry on the farm there
shall be retained for that purpose all my horse hold
and Kitchen furniture & cooking utensils of every description
all my farming tools my wagon and two yoke of Oxen
four choice head of horses four white cows & calves and an
average of thirty head of hogs an average lot of twenty head
of sheep one set of Black Smith Tools and one year supply
of every kind of provision as meat corn fodder &c. I do
give and bequeath to my said wife Eliza for and during
the term of her natural life my three negro women Hannah
Marion and Peggy with all their increase my two negro men
Isaac and Cook provided they can be managed in the farm
but if they become unmanageable I direct my executors to
sell them & apply the proceeds to the purchase of other
farm hands to supply the place of the said negroes
Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Ezekiel a horse &
saddle each provided they shall not have yet
already received the same from me before my death
Fourthly I direct the whole of my personal property
