The last will and Testament of Leonard Miles. In the name
of God. Amen. I Leonard Miles of the State of Tennessee
and County of Franklin being weak in body but of sound
mind do make & ordain this my last will & Testament
nowaking all & every other. First. That all my just
debts of Contracts, be justly and truly paid. Secondly I give
and bequeath the whole of my estate both personal &
real unto my beloved wife Mary Miles during her
natural life. Thirdly after her death I do give &
bequeath to my children as follow. To Polly Cawthron
one dollar. To Elizabeth Atwood one dollar one
feather bed & Trunk. To Sally Martin one
dollar. To Nancy Lee one dollar. To William Miles
one dollar. To Leonard Miles one dollar. To Patsey Lindsay.
Sheirs one hundred & fifty acres of land including the plantation
where I now live & one feather bed to her daughter
Polly Lindsay. Fourthly. I do appoint William
Atwood my executor to settle all my Earthly business
etc etc. Sealed & acknowledged this first day of April
A.D. 1835 Leonard Miles

Cornelius Darrell last Will

In the name of God, Amen.

Cornelius Darrell of the State of Tennessee of County of Franklin, Knowing
& believing that it is appointed for all men once to die & that a Great
& General Judgment; but being weak in body but sound in mind memory
& knowing that my exit, or departure from this world of truth must come
do make & constitute this to be my last will & testament in the following
manner, 1st I commit my soul to God who gave it. 2^d And my
body to its mother earth to be buried in a decent manner by my friend
or executor. I then will furthermore that all my property both real
& personal estate that the Lord hath blessed me with in this world
I will that it should be sold the land to be sold on one, two and
three years pay; the negro or negroes to be sold on one years pay
for the sake of not parting my negro from her husband, if
Henry Dally will give within twenty five dollars of what she
or they are worth he is to have them, otherwise to be sold to the
highest bidder, all my personal property to be sold on twelve month
credit then I will that all my lawful debts be paid out of
the same & the balance of the money of said estate after giving my
beloved Children Common English schooling be put on interest
until my beloved sons and daughters come of age. Calvin R.
John B. & Mary Ann Darrell for them to have an equal part of
the estate as they come of age the same to be divided by my lawful
Executor John Broadway whom I do nominate & appoint
for that purpose. In testimony whereof I have affixed my
hand & seal this 21st June 1835
