or widowhood and provided she should marry that she
pay half rent for the land; and likewise one work
creature worth fifty dollars & two cows & calves & two
beds and furniture, one pot and one oven with one hun-
dred and twenty dollars. And the balance of my
perishable property to be sold and the money arising
therefrom I give and bequeath - that my son Constant
shall have one hundred dollars. And my son Thomas
shall have one hundred dollars. And my daughter
Teresa Carmel shall have a negro boy by the name of
Lindsey & twenty dollars. And my daughter Nancy
Caroline I give a negro boy named Lerry and one
hundred dollars when it can be got by the rent of my

land or the hire of my negroes. And my sons William
and Samuel & and John and Edmond and Lewis; and
my daughter Mary ann the balance of the money arising
from my perishable property with my mill and one
yard and all the land lying on the west side of the
creek to be sold; and the hire of my negroes and the
rent of my land also one Lot in Glasgow to be sold
and equally divided among the six last named
children; and when my youngest child comes of age
my negroes and the balance of my land to be sold and
equally divided the money arising from that sale
amongst all my children. And I do appoint Joseph
Dean & John Pinkerton to be my Executors of this my

3^d I have and bequeath to my daughter Lavina Blair (otherwise) McKisno as much as shall be of value sufficient to make up the said Lavina's part or share so as to amount to the same of any of the others above named after the deduction of one hundred and fifty dollars or taken out of the same and making it on her an equal to any of the rest and said amount that is coming to said Lavina's part to be paid so soon as all or the whole of the money may be collected of said estate or so soon as there is sufficient funds collected to discharge the same.

And lastly I nominate and appoint my friends William Barrow and George McKisno executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made.
