

Wife Martha her two Beds & the furniture to be hers & her disposal at her death Also I give and bequeath unto my son James M. C. Moore and his heirs, black slaves and cupboard's furniture also all my stock sheep, like wise the tract or ~~plantation~~ of Land wherein I now live and bounded as follows viz Beginning at a hick in the north boundary line of an original tract held jointly Between my self and brown Parkison but now now divided running thence East 65 poles to a hick, then north twenty & a half poles to a stake the south west corner of A. M. Gallaway's land thence east with his line sixty seven poles to a post Oak then south forty eight & half poles to a black oak thence west sixty seven poles to a white oak thence south eighteen poles to a stake the north west corner of said entry thence east sixty seven poles to a chestnut & hick thence south twenty three and half poles to a stake thence west sixty seven poles to a stake on the original line thence south with said line twenty three & one fourth poles to three hick trees thence west sixty ~~five~~ poles to a stake thence north ninety two & half to the beginning I likewise I nominate & appoint my James M. C. Moore my executor of this my last will and Testament all the balance of my property not mentioned in this my last will Testament I leave and bequeath unto my wife Martha to be at her disposal as she pleases I witness Whereunto I have set my hand & affixed my seal this 15th day of March 1849
