County. Calling to remembrance the shortness and
uncertainty of my life and now being in my
proper mind and wishing to dispose of my worldly
possessions in a manner which may be agreeable
to my own will do now make this my last will
& testament revoking all others.

It is my will that so much of the property after
my decease be sold as shall be sufficient to
pay off all my just debts and after this with
whole of the remainder of my Cestah Lands
and property of every kind I will and bequeath
to my beloved wife Rebecca during her life
at her death to dispose of among our children
as she may think best except she should
be disposed to enter into the marriage rela-
tion again & should she ever do this the
property shall then all be sold and an
equal distribution be made between her
and each of the children. and I also leave
at the executors execution of this my last
will and testament my beloved wife Rebecca
Co & my son George Coleman as witness

J. Wilby Barker of the County of Kent and State of Tunbridge
being of sound mind and memory but in full health and
calling to mind the mortality of the body and uncertainty of
life have this day ordained and constituted this my last
will and Testament that is first I will and request that
my body be decently buried and that my soul return
to God that Giv it - I will and bequeath that so much
of my personal property be sold by my executors as
may be necessary to pay all my just debts and funeral
expenses then I will and bequeath to each of my three
sons McKinsey Whitterley, Norman & Whitterley and
Joseph & Whitterley in Good father bed & furniture
to be disposed to each of them as hereunder or call for
I will and bequeath to my two daughters Margaret &
Rebecca A. my Stock of horses to be equally divided
between them. I will and bequeath to my son Charles
H. all the remainder of my stock consisting of cattle hogs
& sheep together with all the household and kitchen furniture
to be kept by him for common use and benefit of himself
and his two Sisters Margaret & Rebecca A. until the
said Rebecca A. becomes of the age of twenty one years then
all the before recited property to be equally divided
between Charles H. Margaret & Rebecca A. and the profits
or proceeds of the stock during that time to be divided
as follows Charles H to have one half and Margaret &
and Rebecca A one fourth each provided nevertheless
if the said Margaret & or Rebecca A. should marry before
the time set apart for division in the foregoing clause
then in that event the furniture and stock on hand
may be divided so as to set apart to the one so married
their proportion of said stock & furniture I also will
and bequeath to my son Charles H all my fishing tools
now in hand including maggot and gleaning to keep
and used for the benefit of the family I further
will and bequeath to my son McKinsey or Whitterley
one hundred Dollars out of my estate to be paid in the

following manner as I hold a note on him the said Mr. W. Whittenburg for eighty dollars due the 21st day of November 1831 with a credit of forty dollars, now I allow the said note to be given up without calculating the interest, and the remaining forty dollars to be paid by my son Charles out of the proceeds of the Stock or any money may come into his hands to be paid over as current or when we apply for and lastly I now make and appoint my son Norman H. Leftwich of the County of Lincoln & State of Indiana being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make, ordain and publish this as my Last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all other wills by me at any time made First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of any money I may die possessed of or out of any that may first come into the hands of my executors during my life or midweek my negro George together with the following described tract of land to wit beginning at the southwest corner of my original 209 acre tract purchased from William Pittman running thence north 129 poles with the section line to a line in Jacob Russells line thence west with my original line to the end of W. Russells line thence north to A. G. Gillis line thence west to the top of the hill to A. G. Gillis line thence south to my original tract thence west to a bark at A. G. Gillis gate on the branch therefrom the branch with its ramifications until a due course met there the north & south fence near Gramys and east of the line running to the other down the creek with L. W. Leftwich to the fountain spring thence with the creek to opposite L. W. Leftwich house thence to the

Dimmick considering the uncertainty of this life and being weak in body yet of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament to wit that is to say I do give and bequeath to my son Joseph Leboe of my horses saddle and bridle one to be secondly I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Hannah S. Dimmick all the rest of my property both real and personal and all money that I have on hand or may have coming to me in any way during her natural life and at her death it is my will that after giving to the younger children equal to what I have given the oldest that the rest be equally divided all my children and lastly I do hereby appoint Hannah S. Dimmick my sole executor to act without having security in any way and be at liberty to move property where
