I Noah Ryals of Lincoln County State of Tennessee being on a bed of sickness but of sane mind do make & ordain this my last will & Testament, for the disposal of that property both real & personal wherewith God has blessed me & which I find myself now possessed. first I bequeath my soul to God who gave it & my body to the grave with suitable interment. Secondly to my beloved wife Ryals I bequeath the tract of land whereon I now live, during her natural life or widowhood together with the appurtenances thereof belonging the profits & emoluments arising from which is nevertheless to be applied by her to the decent support & education of our children, after a sufficient subsistence for herself, but at her death or if she shall again marry I wish the land sold to the highest bidder on terms that may be thought the most advantageous of the money, thus arising to be put out in safe hands on interest untill our youngest child shall have attained the age of twenty one the proceeds to be equally divided among my seven children, Malahar, Nancy, William Mary Ann Martha Jane Eliza & the youngest child except answered the balance of my property I wish sold on 12 months credit to the highest bidder except such as may be absolutely necessary for the use of the family & after my debts are all paid I want the balance of the money thus arising to be used for the support & education of my children. I do hereby revoke annul & make void all other wills by me heretofore made & do fully ordain & establish this my last will & Testament I do hereby constitute my wife Rebecca Ryals sole executrix to this my last will & Testament & do not make the Court to bind her to security. I William R. Warren of the State of Tennessee and County of Lincoln being of sound mind & perfect recollection do make this my last will & Testament. And first I do bequeath & give my soul to God who gave it & in the second place that all my just debts be paid. 3^d I do bequeath & give all my real & personal Estate to my beloved wife Sarah Warren for five years & as my heirs consist of six that each of them have a fifty dollar horse, viz Robert Warren William Warren, James Warren, Peter Warren, Samuel Warren, I do will & bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Warren all my land during her natural life or widowhood to raise the children. I do will to my daughter Mary Warren out of my estate what will make fifty dollars also Sarah Warren fifty dollars & to my daughter Elizabeth Warren sixty five dollars & to my daughter Martha Warren one hundred dollars. And at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Sarah Warren all my property real & personal to be equally divided among the named heirs of my body except to Mary Warren to which I bequeath out of my estate fifty dollars more & all the rest of the named heirs twenty five dollars more & if there is more property than will make my daughter more than my daughter Nancy Jean has had for her to have an equal share with them this done & subscribed to in the year of our Lord 1835 August 28
