Rubin Washburn Last Will

State of Minnesota Lincoln County

Being ignorant in intellect but indisposed in body
and knowing life to be uncertain and wishing
to make such a disposition of my worldly goods
as to me seemeth equitable and just with a con-
science void of offence towards all men I make
this my last will and testament and for the re-
tinue of my course I appeal to the Great Judge
of all the earth amine

Art 1st. In the fear of God I bequeath my soul to
him who gave it and disposes of all things

Art 2^d. I will to my son Abram my two daughters
Mary Elizabeth & Louisa Jane and my Grand
child Charlotte Mooring the farm and tract
of land where I now live and all my proper-
ty both real and personal during the space
of four years to come in consideration of
which my said son Abram is to reside at the
dwelling & now do and take care and support
my said daughters Mary Elizabeth & Louisa
Jane and support and educate my said Grand
child Charlotte Mooring during the above
stipulated time

Art 3^d. I will that ~~any~~ Money or property which my
son Abram may accumulate by his own
industry on the farm after destroying the a-
bove named expense be his to all intents
and purposes but provided that any

Money or property arise from the rents of the said
land or otherwise not having named at the end
of four years to be equally divided between
my said son Abram and my two daughters
Mary Elizabeth & Louisa Jane

Art 4th. The respiration of four years to come I
that my land in full and all my effects what
soever after all my just debts are paid be
equally divided between my several children
and Grand child Charlotte Mooring with the
exception that my two daughters Mary Elizabeth
& Louisa Jane have each a horse worth five
dollars fifteen dollars worth of cattle ten head
of sheep bed and furniture and every thing
that they may make by their own industry
during the said four years more than the
rest of my heirs and also that thirty three dol-
lars each be taken from the shears of my sons
John and Abram & making in all fifty five doll-
ars and be given to my Grand child Charlotte
Mooring.

Art 5th. I will and request that my friend James
Thompson be and is hereby appointed my
executor to this my last will and testament
and that the said executor take the money
or property of my Grand child Charlotte Mooring
and to do the best he can with it until
she arrives at the age of twenty one years

of age when she will be the legitimate owner
in Testimony whereof I subscribe my name and affix
my seal this the 20th day of February in the
year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty
four
