

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother
 Barnet Merce an equal share of all the property
 money and effects that I may die possessed of.
 Sixthly I give and bequeath to my beloved sister
 Adeline Payeringer Consort of Thomas A Payeringer and
 Equal share of all of the property money and effects
 that I may die possessed of. Seventhly I give and be-
 queath to my beloved Brother David M Merce an
 equal share of all the property money and effects
 that I may die possessed of. Eighthly I give and
 bequeath to Gallan Merce an equal share of all the
 property money and effects that I may die possessed
 of. Ninthly I give and bequeath to my sister Eliza
 Merce an equal share of all the property money and
 effects that I may die possessed of.
 Tenthly I give and bequeath to my sister Delina
 Merce an equal share of all my property money and
 effects that I may die possessed of. Eleventhly I give
 and bequeath to my sister Sarah E. Merce an equal
 share of all the property money and effects that I
 may die possessed of. Twelfthly I give and bequeath
 to my Brother John Merce an equal share of all
 my property money and effects that I may die possessed
 taking out of John's share a thirty four with Interest
 dollar note which I hold against him with Mother
 security to said note as wish his not to be disturbed
 on said note of hand. Lastly I do hereby nominate
 and appoint P. M. Harper and John M. Mott my
 Executors in witness whereof I do to this my Will
 set my hand and seal this 21st day of August 1850

I Robert M. McLellan make and publish this as my
 last will and testament, hereby revoking and making
 void all other wills by me at any time made First
 I direct that my funeral Expenses and all debts
 be paid as soon after my death as possible out of
 any money that I may die possessed of or may
 first come into the hands of my Executors. Secondly
 I give and bequeath to Sarah McLellan my Negro
 Man Jacob and at her death to become the property
 of Abraham McLellan their oldest Children (viz)
 Robert J. Margaret D. and Susan J. all three to
 be Equally interest in said Negro Man at the
 death of their Mother Sarah McLellan Thirdly I
 give and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter
 Jane (Davis the former wife of Abolaine Davis
 six hundred Dollars to be Equally divided between
 her six Children It is my wish and I also make
 it a part of this my last will that Henry Davis
 heirs are to be entitled to one hundred dollars
 which is their father's interest in the above six
 hundred dollars and that William Davis
 to receive one hundred dollars their father's
 interest in the before mentioned six hundred
 dollars Fourthly I give and bequeath to the
 heirs of my daughter Sarah Wilson (who marries
 wife of James Wilson) six hundred dollars to be
 Equally divided between the heirs of her body
 Fifthly I give and bequeath to the heirs of my
 daughter Nancy McKite six hundred dollars
 to be divided Equally between her two Children
 Robert McKite and Samuel McKite.
 Sixthly I give and bequeath to the heirs of Eliza
 McLellan Mary Gregory and her heirs William
 McLellan and Joseph McLellan my Negro
 Man Bill which is at this time in Williamson
 County and all the money that may be due

me after paying my funeral Expenses my
debts and Eight hundred dollars as directed
in this my last will the balance together with
the Negro Man Bill as before mentioned to be
Equally divided between Eliza (McClain) her
Mary Gregory and her heirs William (McClain)
and Joseph (McClain) It is my will and my wish
that the Negro Man Bill be sold on a credit
of twelve months to the highest bidder I want
Eliza (McClain) her to have one fourth Mary
Gregory and her heirs one fourth William
McClain one fourth by him accounting for
one hundred and fifty dollars which I paid
him and Joseph (McClain) one fourth
eventually I give and bequeath to Mrs Sarah
McClain two youngest daughter Maria Thompson
McClain and Sarah Elizabeth Milson (McClain)
my Negro Man Granville (at this time hired to
Henry Kelso) to be Equally interested in said
Negro Man I also give and bequeath to them
two beds and furniture and my Chest.
Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint John
McClain and John Clark Jr. my Executors In
witness where of I do to this my will set my hand
and seal this the 20th July 1850.

Whereas I Andrew M. Walker Being in my proper
And right Reasonable Mind Have thought
proper to make Constitute and Ordain this
my last will and Testament
(To Wit)

Then the first— My will and desire is that all
my just debts be paid in the first place
Then the second— My desire and wish is that my
wife Elizabeth Walker hold and possess all
my landed Estate (To Wit) the tract of land
now live up containing One hundred and
nineteen acres more or less also the present
Crop of Corn belonging to the same also
two other small tracts of land situated and
lying over the Creek on the Ridge One
containing twenty four acres the other
contains twenty acres more or less and
lies joining together bounded on the North
by the Widow Roundtree's land on the East
by Joseph Long's on the South by William
Brown's land and on the West by L. H. H. H.
and David Roughton's land Together with
all the improvements improvements or in any
wise appertaining to the same and all the
household and Kitchen furniture also
the farming tools and all the Stock of
every description what ever thereunto belong
or be any way thereunto appertaining also
my two Negro Boys Perry and Emory the
property my wife Elizabeth is to hold and
possess during her natural life or she
remains my Widow. But in case or
provided she should Marry she thereby forfeit
