Robert Stephen's Will.

The last will & Testament of Robert Stephen, of the County of Lincoln & state of Tennessee. Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life & being in sound mind & memory thanking Almighty God for the same. I do make this last will and Testament in manner & form following. Now I will that all my just debts as shall be by me owing at my death, with my funeral expenses shall in the first place be paid. I give & bequeath to my beloved son James Stephen, the tract or parcel of land that I now live on containing 177 acres also 30 acres lying bounded by William Polson & Benjamin Niles, I give & bequeath to my second son James Stephen, one negro woman Raney & her two Children Robert & Lucy, I give & bequeath to my third son Joseph Stephen one Negro man Peter & negro woman Silver. I give & bequeath to my fourth son Henry Stephen three hundred dollars in money. I give & bequeath to Robert Randolph Stephen son of James Stephen one hundred dollars in money. I give & bequeath to my grand daughter Sarah Ann Franklin the daughter of David Franklin one Negroe girl Eliza with her offspring. And if Sarah Ann Franklin shall depart this life before the age of eighteen years or her marrying then the said girl shall be the property of Theophilus Franklin the son of David Franklin. I will that Sarah Ann Mother Sarah Franklin the wife of David Franklin shall have the use of the girl Eliza during Sarah Ann's minority or death. also I give to the said Sarah Ann one bed, bedstead & furniture bone
heirloom. I give & bequeath to my daughter Sarah Franklin the wife of David Franklin Twenty dollars in money. I give & bequeath to my Grand son Theophilus Franklin the son of David Franklin one bed bedstead & furniture. I give to my Negroe woman Betty one hundred dollars in money. also the said Betty to have the liberty of living with any of my children that she may like best. I give to my negroes Ned, Peter Silver & Raney ten dollars each in money. I will that my Negroe Ned shall be sold to the highest bidder on a

In twelve months Credit. also I will that all my stock of all kind with all farming utensils, with Household & kitchen furniture be sold on twelve months Credit. I will that if there be a residue of moneys left there money shall be equally divided between Tennessee Stephen & Mary Stephen the daughter of James Stephen & Charity Ann Stephen the daughter of Joseph Stephen. I do nominate & appoint Charles Bright of the County of Lincoln & state of Tennessee & John Moorhead of the County aforesaid Executors of this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this November 10th 1835.
