

Thomas Luthicum

This my last will & Testament. In the name of God. Amen.
 I Thomas Luthicum senior of the state of Tennessee Sumner County
 being weak in body but of sound memory (Pledge be god) At this
 day the 24th of August 1831 do make and publish this my
 last will & testament. In manner following that is to say
 first I give my daughter Elizabeth Norwood one hundred
 & fifty acres of land it being the tract or parcel of land
 on which I now live lying & being in state of County above
 mentioned to her during her natural life, she
 making no waste or destruction thereupon and from &
 after her decease I give & deliver the same to my
 said grand sons Thomas & William Owen, it to be
 equally divided between them for the term of their
 natural life. I also give & bequeath to said
 Norwood my grand daughter my feather bed, steel &
 furniture to have & to hold during her natural life
 Also I give & bequeath to my son William fifty
 acres of land it being lying in the state of County
 aforesaid joining the tract of land wherein I now
 live, lying & joining the north end of the tract of
 land wherein I now live to have & to hold during
 his natural life and from & after the decease of
 my said son William Luthicum then to remain to
 the first son or daughter of my son William lawfully
 issuing. And for default of such issue then to the
 use & behoof of the aforesaid grand sons equally
 Thomas & William Owen during their natural life
 I Thomas Luthicum as my last will & testament
 is that all my personal property shall be sold to
 the highest bidder or to the best advantage on
 a credit of twelve months and all my just debts
 paid & the remainder I give & bequeath to my
 daughter Elizabeth Norwood to have & to hold
 during her natural life. I Thomas Luthicum
 of the state of County aforesaid as my last will and

testament is, I make and ordain John Norwood my said sole Executors
 of this my last will in trust for the intents & purposes in this my will
 contained & make them my loving friends John Norwood & James McDavid
 overseers of this my will to take care & see the same performed
 according to my true intent & meaning & for their pains & trouble I
 direct that each of them shall be liberally paid &c.

 to this my last will & testament set my hand & seal the day
 above written. Signed sealed & delivered by the said Thomas
 Luthicum, as & for his last will & testament in the presence
 of us who were present at the signing & sealing thereof

Ann St. McCurdy's last will.

In the name of God, Amen. I Ann St. McCurdy of the state
 Tennessee of Sumner County being sick & weak of body but of sound
 mind & disposing memory for which I thank God & calling to
 mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to
 dispose of all such worldly substance as it hath pleased God
 to bless me with. I give & bequeath to my oldest
 daughter Mary A. H. Davis & the heirs of her body one
 negro woman called Rose and her children that is in
 said Davis's possession. And I give & bequeath to my
 daughter Elizabeth L. McKinley's three youngest children one
 negro woman named Mariob & her offspring from this date
 and to son Joseph McKinley I give eighteen or nineteen dollars
 it being the balance of the price of my land that is in
 his hands. And I give & bequeath to my four grand children
 the heirs of my son John H. McCurdy all my right to the
 plantation I now live on containing one hundred & thirty
 acres as I paid son John for said land & never obtained
