

# Vincent Haraldson Will

I Vincent Haraldson being sick in body and of sound mind do make and ordain this my last will and Testament.

1<sup>st</sup> It is my wish that my land and negro remain in possession of my wife Mary G. and my three children James H. Ephraim L. and Elizabeth W. Haraldson and all my other property with the exception of as much as my executors may find necessary to sell to pay my last debts.

2<sup>d</sup> It is my desire if my wife Mary G. should marry again then for my property to be equally divided between her and my three children James H. Ephraim L. and Elizabeth W. Haraldson or that it may be divided equally between them as directed above when the eldest child shall become of age or when any or either of them Marries my wife Mary G. taking a child part of land negroes and all my other property and do as she may see proper with it.

3<sup>d</sup> I appoint my wife Mary G. Haraldson and John L. Henderson my Executors to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal December the 30<sup>th</sup> 1845-

And first I direct that my Body be decently buried in a Christian like manner first it is my will that all my just debt and funeral expenses be paid out of any monies that I may have or that may come in the hands of my executors.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah the tract of Land on which I now live containing one hundred and seventy acres also the tract of Land that I purchased of Thomas Blair of about one hundred and fifty acres unless my executors should think it best to sell the last mentioned tract of Land then it is my will that they advertise the said tract of Land first and
