The last will and testament of Charles Collier I Charles Collier Considering the uncertainty of life and being of sound mind and memory blessed be Almighty God for the same first that all my just debts to be paid I will and bequeath unto my son John Collier one horse colt and I bequeath unto my wife Jane Collier all the rest of my property as long as she remains my widow and the land to remain said Jane Colliers as long as she lives and then to be equally divided amongst my children I appoint my wife Jane Collier my Executrix Signed Sealed and delivered in the presence of us May 25th 1832 Charles Collier

By Wm Blair's last will & testament  
I William Blair of Swan Creek Lincoln County & State of Tennessee being of sound mind & memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body & that I must shortly resign & give up this mortal life. So therefore make Constitude & ordain this my last will & testament in the following manner. And first I Commit my soul in the Hand of God, who gave it & next my body to the earth to be buried with a decent burial. And as to my worldly estate wherof I am possessed I leave devise & bequeath in the following way. And first after the payment of my lawful debts I have devised & bequeath unto Margaret Blair my beloved wife the clothes & beds & bed cloths & household furniture & the bay mare & one cow & calf & one heifer also the right of the plantation during her lifetime (second) If my two sons John & Alexander continue to live on the land & give their mother a decent comfortable support there shall be no other rent required (third) I leave unto my son John Blair one red heifer & one red cow & her pigs also that part of the plantation tools he has got already (fourth) I leave unto my son Alexander Blair one yearling horse colt & the rest of the plantation tools (fifth) after the death of my beloved wife I allow the land to be equally divid amongst my sons & daughters (sixth) I do hereby constitute ordain & appoint my wife Margaret Blair & my son William Blair sole executors of this my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of June A.D. 1832
