 Sarah G. M. Wardlaw, Susan M. G. Blair, Martha
 El. Harris and Amanda M. Mourae. I advise that
 the portion which I have bequeathed to my daughter
 Louisa V. Nolan be placed in the hands of my son
 William Mourae as trustee for her use during her
 lifetime and at her death that the same descend to
 the heirs of her body. I desire that in this event
 I should die before my daughter Amanda M.
 Mourae should marry that she has choice of one
 of my horse and as much property of other kind
 as I have given to each of my daughters that is
 married. I hereby appoint my son William Mourae
 and my daughter William Armstrong, Hugh
 Wardlaw and Susan Blair executors of this my
 last will and testament hereby revoking all former
 wills by me made in testimony whereof I have
