

equally divide between my four daughters now living & my two grand children, bring the division of my daughter Maudie McMillan deceased, they too together to have an equal share with one of the others or one fifth part of the said five hundred & twenty five dollars - I also give to my said two grand children one hundred & fifty dollars each.

Ninth - I give & bequeath to my son Levy Davis fifty dollars

Tenth - I give & bequeath to my two grand children, bring the daughter of my son James Davis one fifty dollar each

Eleventh - I give & bequeath to my son-in-law Holiday Parks four hundred & fifty dollars

Twelfth - It is my will that my negro man Jim, remain on Land my farm the ensuing year for the purpose of making a crop which crop when made is to be sold by my executor. It is further my will, that my said executor keep out my said negro man Jim until such time as he may think it best to sell him & leave to sell him upon such terms & conditions as he may think best.

Thirteenth - It is my will, that all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep, & pigs except what is herein bequeathed to my wife, together with all the residue of my kitchen furniture, farming tools, of every description and every other thing or species of property not herein specially bequeathed, be sold by my executor, and the proceeds applied to the payments of the legacies herein mentioned.

Fourteenth - It is my will if there shall be any thing remaining after paying off the legacies herein before named, the same is to be equally divided between my three daughters, Caroline Parks, Martha Jane & Margaret Elizabeth.

I hereby constitute, nominate & appoint my son in law Holiday Parks sole executor of this my last will & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this ninth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty four.

# William Howell, S.

I William Howell do make & publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking & making void all other wills by me at any time made.

First - I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money I may die possessed of or may come into the hands of my executors Secondly - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Katherine all of my slaves which I now have or after the negroes will be my Son, Allen, Sammy & Miles, & all the perishable property, all of my household and kitchen furniture after all of my debts are paid out of said property.

Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Catharine May two negroes, to art, Groce and Miles, also one cow and calves, one bed & furniture which she has received that being all that I intend for her or her heirs out of my effects to have.

Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my son Robert William the tract of land he now possesses, worth five hundred dollars two horses and saddle, worth eighty dollars each three cows and calves worth each one gun worth fifteen dollars one bed and furniture.

Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my son David James one tract of land worth three hundred and twenty five dollars, one saddle, worth sixteen dollars and ten dollars in cash, one cow & calf worth eight dollars and bed and furniture.

Sixthly - I give and bequeath to my son John Wesley one tract of land worth five hundred dollars, one horse worth fifty dollars, one saddle worth fifteen dollars, one cow & calf worth eight dollars, one bed & furniture.

Seventhly - I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary one horse worth thirty five dollars, two cows & <sup>one</sup> calf worth eight dollars each, one bed & furniture.

Eighthly - I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Miller one tract of land worth sixteen three hundred dollars and one cow and calf worth eight dollars, one horse worth sixty dollars, one saddle worth sixteen dollars, one bed & furniture.

Twenty — I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Jane, one horse worth thirty four dollars, one cow and calf, worth eight dollars, one pig and fourteen.

Twenty One — I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Caroline one horse worth thirty four dollars, one cow and calf worth eight dollars, one pig and fourteen.

Twenty Two — All the above named property heretofore received by the above named heirs and which valuation I wish to remain and attorney & to be a set off of their distributive share of my estate at the death of my wife Katherine without any deduction or interest thereon. It is my wish that all the property be sold at the death of my wife and my heirs make equal manly, Jacob William, Maria Anna, James, John Wesley, Mariah Ann, Samuel Minton, Eliza Jane, Martha Caroline. Lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint David James Powell, John Wesley Powell & Samuel Minton Powell my executors. In witness whereof I do to this my will set my hand & seal this 11th day of September 1844.

I John Moore, being under state of health but of sound mind, do make and ordain this my last will & testament. My first I wish all my just debts to be paid, and it is my will that my whole Estate both real and personal be equally divided between my two children (viz) John Moore & May Hinds after disposing of the following items in the following manner I give to William Johnson two hundred dollars and his choice of my Gray Felt & I hereby confirm and contract with William H. Smith and do convey to him my Girl Jane for the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid me when called for say \$250 and two hundred & fifty dollars to be paid

several months after my death I do also will that old and faithful servant Lucy be liberated and set free and being appointed William H. Smith her Guardian agent to do and perform all that the laws of Tennessee may require to perfect the same and place her in his possession at my death. It is my wish that my beloved children as here named John Moore & May Hinds divide the Balance of my slaves equally between themselves and such other persons as may live then after which sell the balance and divide equally as above specified and to carry the above into effect I appoint my son John Moore my son in law Thomas Hinds and my friend William H. Smith my executors this 10th day of October 1844 signed & sealed in presence of

Fourth. I give to my daughter Hannah forty dollars and Grace to Felix each fifty dollars and to the children of my daughter Jane who intermarried
