## William Barnes Last Will & Testament.

I William Barnes being of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following:

First I desire that all my just debts of every description be paid as soon as possible.

2. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane Barnes all my property of every description during her widowhood subject nevertheless the above and all my estate to be paid to each her self, or my sons arriving at twenty one years of age or on the marriage of my daughter Sarah Jane De Kalt to be divided equally amongst them.

3. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Barnes out of the above estate a certain negro Child named Harriet nevertheless the said Sarah to have an equal share of all my remaining property with the balance of my heirs.

4. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane De Kalt Barnes out of the above estate a certain negro child named Adeline nevertheless the said Jane De Kalt to enjoy and inherit an equal portion of my estate with my remaining heirs.

5. I give and bequeath unto my sons Thomas, William, Clark, Walter & Matthias Barnes an equal portion of the above named estate bequeathed to my wife Jane P. Barnes in common with my daughter Sarah & Jane De Kalt except the two negroes Harriet & Adeline which the said Sarah & Jane De Kalt are to have over and above an equal portion of my estate with the remainder of my heirs.

6. I give and bequeath unto my step daughter Caroline Watson a horse to be valued at fifty dollars on her marriage.

And lastly I appoint my friends Thomas Massey & William H. Dugay my sole executors to this my last will and Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December 1832.

## Zachariah Arnold

### Last

### Will & Testament

In the Name of God Amen. I Zachariah Arnold of the county of Lincoln and State of Tennessee being in sound mind and memory desposing for which I thank God and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly substance that it hath pleased God to bless me with.

1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Charlotte the tract of land I now live on with all the house hold and kitchen furniture the farm and farming tools and also all the stock of horses cattle and hogs that I now have in my possession and as many of the stock of negroes that I now have as she may think proper to keep during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or marriage the above named property to be disposed of in the following manner, viz, that is to say all the house hold and kitchen furniture and all the stock farming tools but such as I shall here after mention to be sold and equally divided between my daughter Nancy Children and my daughter Mary, Patsy, Melinda, and Malissa, I give and bequeath to my son Moses Arnold all the tract of land he now lives on on the south side of Little River adjoining the land of James Forsyth and also fifty acres granted to Middleton Conch, I will and bequeath to my son Andrew W. Arnold all the tract of land I now live on dedicated to me by James Bright also half the Moore tract adjoining the same tract and also twelve acres dedicated to me by Hudson also nine acres adjoining the same granted to me, I will and bequeath to my son John Arnold one hundred dollars and I will and bequeath to William Arnold a sum of John Arnold one hundred dollars, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Children one negro boy by the name of Major, I will and bequeath to my daughter Melinda one negro boy by the

man of Williamson also will and bequeath to my daughter Melissa our negro woman name Lucy and her issues. I bequeath of the personal property that I have now in my possession or may have undisposable of after paying all my just debts to be equally divided between my daughter Nancy Sheldon and my other four daughters that is the property I need not specify in the will as this is my last will and Testament. And lastly I appoint and constitute my son Sanders W. Arnold and my son-in-law Jared Simmons Executors to this my last will and Testament by me assigned. Given under my hand and seal this third day of October Eighteen hundred and thirty four signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us William Gorffis

Will and Testament

In the Name of God Amen.

Whereas I the undersigned Jeremiah Dwyer of the county of Lincoln and State of Tennessee though weak in body yet enjoying a sound and perfect memory and understanding and considering that all must die I have thought proper to make publick and declare the following to be my last will and testament. 1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rosannah during her natural life and at her death to descend to my son Newton Perry one feather bed and furniture one corner Cupboard one long pendulum Clock one dining Table one cotton whale one looking glass two sitting chairs two bed stands and four head of sheep. 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my sons Newton Perry and William Carroll Dwyer one feather bed and their furniture each which I estimate at worth      dollars each. I have already given to my son James Boyer upon his setting out upon life one Year one feather bed a stock of bogs and a small tract of Land all of which I estimate as worth Two hundred dollars. And as he possesses the advantage of mature manhood whilst some other of my children are helpless minors I give and bequeath to him the further sum of Thirty dollars as a final settlement of all accounts, debts, legacies and bequests to my daughter Jane Bolen and her husband Elijah I have given already one mare one cow and some hogs which I estimate as worth fifty dollars to George F. Bryan my son

I have already given one mare one cow and one bed and furniture and some hogs which I estimate as worth fifty dollars. It is my will and desire that after any necessary Executor who I hereafter appoint sell all my lands with their appurtenances on a credit of one, two and three years one third of the price thereof I give and bequeath to my wife Rosannah during her life then to descend to our son Newton Perry Dwyer in the room of her dying in the said lands which she agrees to accept of. My stock of horses cattle sheep and hogs a few waggon wheels and all other implements and utensils farming Tools House hold and Kitchen furniture of all and every name and description I direct that it or they be sold on a credit of twelve months by my Executors that are not already bequeathed or have otherwise disposed of. To Joel Brainerd Shanks give in trust my black mew Jack and direct that the said trustee allow and permit him the said Jack to hire his own time at Forty dollars for each year until he the said Jack shall pay to my Estate the sum of Five hundred dollars over and above his hire then I will and direct that he acquire freedom in conformity to law. My slave Hetty I give and bequeath to Robert Moore and estimate her value at two hundred and fifty dollars and direct that Bob be sold as the other chattels of my estate. It is my will and desire that all my debts be paid and that the net proceeds of my Estate be divided amongst my children equally after deduction of all charges with an outfit which shall have accounted to my estate the amount already named by them or any special gift or bequest in this my last will set forth. I hereby nominate and appoint Joel Brainerd and Malachi Rivers or either of them Executors to this my last will and Testament. The Legacy or filial Portion of my daughter Mary now married to William Justice I will and desire that my Executors retain in their own hands in trust and pay over to them the said William and Mary Justice in such sums as a prudent necessity may require. Five hundred dollars is all that I require of each before he acquires a right to freedom and insert this item in explanation of the clause on the subject which was made to read by intitulation as though I required that sum over his yearly hire. Such legacy or filial Portion as may be coming out of my estate to Elijah Bolen and Jane Bolen I will and desire that my Executors retain in their own hands in trust for their use and pay over the same in such sums as a prudent necessity may require.
