Secondly, I direct, that all my personal estate, be sold on a credit of twelve months, and the proceeds to go first to the payment of my debts and the balance if any to be paid over to my mother, for her own special use and benefit, but I further direct that my mother shall pay, one half of the above named balance, of the proceeds of my personal estate to my sister, Mary Ann, to be hers forever,

Third I give and bequeath to my mother all my land to be hers during her natural life, and at her death, to be sold, and the proceeds, to be divided as follows, Brother Manson, to have one hundred dollars, Brother Oliver to have fifty dollars and my two sisters Mary Ann and Sarah to have one hundred dollars each, and then the balance after all expenses paid, to be equally divided among the above named legatees and all of the rest of my brothers and sisters.
