

The Nineteenth of William A. Robinson a
Citizen of Lincoln County in the State of Minnesota

I William A. Robinson being of sound mind
and disposing memory to make and publish the following
as my last will & testament

It is my will and desire that all my property
of every kind be sold and after my funeral expenses
and just debts are paid that the balance be
equally divided between my wife Sophronia &
my child Stephen Fayette Robinson

In the undersigned Stephen A. Brown
& Henry Robinson do state that we were present
when the above named William A. Robinson made
his nineteen will that it was made in his last
sick bed at his own dwelling house that he was of
sound and disposing mind and memory that he
directed his property to be disposed of in the manner
above stated and called upon us to take
notice that he had always consulted us in his
important matters This 1st day of October 1853

The Last will and testament of Benj G. Sharp
I Benjamin G. Sharp do make and publish this as my
last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills
by me at any time made

Item the 1st It is my will that all of my just debts and
funeral expenses be paid after my death as soon as
possible out of any money that I may have on hand
and if the money I have on hand at my death shall
not be sufficient to pay my debts then I
want my executor herein after named to see my stock
crops & two wagons to pay my said debts

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my sister Nancy Gracy
certain negroes to wit Elizabeth Smith Cathenia

Gracy John W. Gracy Francis Gracy William
Gracy Tranquilia Gracy & Belinda Gracy
all of my negroes these negroes are to be valued
and each of my said sisters children is to
have the one hundred in value of them. It is
my request that my friends Rubin A. McDonald
James Bright & C. L. Stone or any two of them make
value of said negroes and divide them equally
between my said sisters seven children. In making
such division my friends as above named may charge
the allotment to any one or more of said children
with such sum or sums as shall be necessary to make
the division of said negroes equal & equitable between
my said sister Nancy's seven children

Item 3rd It is my will that my executor if there should
be any balance remaining after paying my debts
out of the proceeds of the sale of the stock and crops
or the notes on hand at my death shall lend such
balance out at interest for the purpose hereinafter
named.

Item 4th It is my will that my Executor sell the tract
of land containing about ninety acres miller
to me by my mother on a credit of one & two
years at public auction to the highest bidder
upon the premises after giving thirty days notice
by putting up written advertisements one on the
premises & two or more public places in Lincoln
County Minnesota

my executor will retain a lien on said Land to secure
stock & crops with sufficient security for the payment
of the purchase money for said land.

Item 5th It is my will that my executor out of the proceeds
of the sale of said Land shall retain enough together
with the balance if any remaining of the sale of the
Stock & Crop after paying my debts as aforesaid to make
my niece Alice Sherill equal to what I have given
to my said Sister Nancy Seven Children that is
her Share is to be equal to the one seventh of the value
of said negroes settled to said children as aforesaid

Item 6th If there should be any remaining balance of
the purchase Money for the tract of Land directed
to be sold as aforesaid before mentioned then it is my
will that said balance of the purchase money be equally
divided between my said Sister Nancy Seven
Children & said Alice Sherill

Item 7th I will and bequeath to my Sister Nancy the
tract of land on which I now live containing
about one hundred Acres for and during her natural
life and at her death it is my will that said
tract of Land be sold by my executor, reserving the
family burying ground about one half of an acre
upon a credit of One two and three Years at public
Auction to the highest bidder upon the premises
after giving thirty days notice of the time &
place in towns of sale by putting up written
advertisements on the premises or on the Court
house door in Fayetteville ^{or} ^{and} in Vincennes and at four
or more public places in ^{and} Lincoln County
My Executor will take bond & good security for
the purchase money for said land and also retain
a lien on the same until that money is paid

The proceeds of this tract of land I will to be
equally divided between my Sister Nancy

Seven Children and my niece Alice Sherill

Item 8th It is my will that my executor lend out
the money hereby bequeathed to my niece
Alice Sherill from Year to Year taking
bond & good security until my said
niece arrive to the age of twenty one years

or manus when either of these events shall take place then my
said executor will pay said money with the interest thereon
to my said niece Alice Sherill but if my said niece should
die before either of these contingencies happen as above named
then it is my will that said money & interest thereon be equally
divided between my said Sisters Nancy Seven Children
having before named

Item 9th I will to my Sister Nancy all of my house hold & kitchen
furniture farming utensils & also my Buggy & one set of
blacksmith tools

Item 10th In the event that I shall become entitled to any
portion of the three hundred Dollars willed by my
mother to my niece Alice Sherill then it is my will
that the same be equally divided between my sister
Nancy's seven children. Lastly I do hereby nominate
and appoint John McSmith my Executor

In witness whereof I do to this my will set my hand
and seal this 3rd Sept 1855 - Benjamin C. Sharp Esq

unto it in the presence of the testator this the day
