

Last Will and Testament of Boon Wilson Dec'd and
I Boon Wilson of Seneca County Promised to have by me made
and publish this as my last Will and Testament and hereby
revoking all other and former Wills by me at any time made.

Item 1st This my Will that my Executor hereinafter named, pay
my funeral expenses and all my just debts out of my money
or may have at my death or the first money that may come
to their hands after my death.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Nancy
Wilson for and during the term of her natural life the
following Property - All the land and all the improvements
appertaining thereto which I own except about sixty
acres of my Seneca land tract hereinafter mentioned; two
Negro Men and two Negro Women which she is entitled to
the end of all the Negroes of which I may die possessed; also
all my household and Kitchen furniture except the family
portraits hereinafter mentioned; also three Mules or horses
of which I may die possessed; also three cows and Calves such
as she may choose; also all my Sheep; also twenty five head
of Stock Hogs such as she may choose; also one Yards of Cloth
such as she may choose; also one ^{or} Cask; also ten Turnings plow
and two Bull-Tongue plow such as she may choose; also
three per Geering; also one hundred Barrels of Corn, two
hundred Bushels of Wheat and all the feeders, Oats & Hay
I may have on hand at the time of my death; also one sack of
Coffe and one Barrel of sugar which are to be furnished
to her by my Executors if they are not on hand at the
time of my death; and also two hundred dollars in Cash.
All the articles mentioned in this clause, which are consumed
in three years on a the two hundred dollars in Cash are intended
as an absolute gift.

Item 3^d It is my Will that all the residue of my Stock of Hogs, cattle
Horses, Mules, farming implements of every description, Wagons
and Geering, together with all my grain and every description
of personal property except my Slaves, be sold by my Executors
at public sale in a credit of twelve months.

Item 3rd It is my Will that all my Children to wit; A. M. Wilson
Delina Marshall, Cynthia B. Coffey, George A. Little, Martha
J. Smith, Sarah E. March, Jonas L. Wilson and E. S. Wilson
successively equally in the distribution of my property next
Sarah E. March who is to account for the sum of six hundred

and thirty nine dollars and eighty cents as an advancement in
making distribution.

Item 4th I give and leave to my son Jonas L. Wilson about Sixty acres
of land (the less quantity however to be ascertained by Survey)
being a part of my Seneca land tract to begin at a corner gap
in my line running with the West fork of Seneca Creek, so the
wind to the big Rock, thence along said Rock Westward
to a Rock in James Clark's line and thence Northward and
following the other different courses of the line of the tract to the
beginning to be valued to him at twenty dollars (20\$) per acre
and for which he is to account in the distribution of my property.

Item 5th It is my Will that my Executors hereinafter named divide all
my Slaves which bequeathed to my Wife during her life. Distribute
all the Money arising from the sale of the property mentioned
in the second clause of this Will or from any other source,
equally amongst all my Children, charging my son Jonas
L. Wilson with the value of said tract of land devised to him
and my daughter Sarah March with said sum of \$159.80
in such division - In the event it should not be practicable
to divide the Slaves mentioned in this clause as directed, then
my Executors are hereby authorized to sell said Slaves upon
such terms as they may think advisable, and distribute the
proceeds amongst my Children instead of making division to
the slaves charging Jonas L. and Sarah E. as aforesaid.

Item 6th Upon the death of my Wife it is my Will that the Slaves bequeathed
to her and the interest of such Slaves, if any, be equally divided if
practicable amongst all my Children, also all the household and
Kitchen furniture and any other personal property which I have
bequeathed to my Wife during life. Should my wife remain
at her death - And should it be impracticable to divide such
Slaves and other property after the death of my Wife, then my
Executors will sell such Slaves and other property upon such
terms as they think advisable and distribute the proceeds
equally amongst all my Children.


Item 7th Upon the death of my Wife it is my Will that all the land
which I have devised to her for life shall go to my son E. S.
Wilson, he to take the same at twenty dollars per acre and
he allowed two years to pay for the same in two equal annual
payments from the death of my Wife, he, however is to be entitled
to one eighth of the value of said land and the remaining
sum eightths to be divided amongst my said other Children.

Item 8th On the event any of my Children should die before the
division or distribution of the property in my Will, such
such deceased Child or Children then surviving bears my
Child or Children surviving such Child or Children then
surviving shall be entitled to the interest of the deceased
parent under the Will.

Item 9th I bequeath to my son E. S. Wilson the portrait of myself
and the portrait of my wife

Item 10th I bequeath to my son Jonas L. Wilson the portrait of his
Grandfather James Leathemman

Item 11th It is my desire that my son E. S. Wilson shall live with his
Mother upon such terms as they shall agree, that his Mother
may have the benefit of his society and protection - But this
is intended only as the expression of a desire and not as a
disposition of my right or property.

Item 12th I hereby nominate and appointing said J. H. Wilson
Jonas L. Wilson and E. S. Wilson Executrix of this my
last Will and Testament - In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal Bevnd Wilson 
Signed, sealed and published
in my presence and we have
attested the same in the presence
of each other and in the presence of
the Notary on Thursday the 18th day
of Decembe 1859 and at his request

when Collected, having heretofore made advance-
ment to him. I give unto my Son H. H. Cooper
five dollars having made advancement to him
heretofore. In relation to Sarah White my daugh-
ter now deceased, I have heretofore advanced to
her in her life time her portion. I give unto my Son
J. J. Cooper One hundred & Sixty Dollars to be paid
to him when Collected after my death. I give
unto my daughter Mary Hitchell all the balance
that may be left when all the legacies and my
just debts are paid. Given under my hand and
Seal this 27th day of April 1858. I appoint
J. J. Cooper my Executor.
