Petition of Madison County May 5 1853.

To the Honorable Judge of Probate in and for the County of Madison  
State of Alabama:

The Petition of Charles H. Patten John E. Townsend Samuel  
Townsend and Edmund G. Townsend, Sheweth unto Your Honor  
that Edmund Townsend late a citizen of said County of  
Madison departed this life at his residence in said County after  
having made and published his last will and testament which  
is herewith filed and prayed to be taken as part of this petition  
said last will and testament bears date 25<sup>th</sup> January 1850  
and was signed by said testator in the presence of George  
H. Pratline, Joseph Higginbotham and Lawrence Hobbs who  
subscribed their names thereto in the presence of at the agent  
of said testator.

Petitioners further State, that the said Edmund Townsend  
left no widow children or descendants of children and that the  
following named persons are his next of kin and heirs at  
law. To w<sup>t</sup>. Your petitioner Samuel Townsend who is a brother of  
said testator residing in said County of Madison Henrietta  
Johnson a sister residing in said County of Madison Your petitioner  
John E. Townsend Montford R. Townsend, Samuel G. Townsend  
and Park Townsend, who are children of said testator, with  
Park Townsend, who died in the lifetime of said testator and  
all of whom reside in said County of Madison, Elizabeth wife  
of Archibald Townsend, Jane wife wife of Upton Clegg, Rose  
wife of Jonaed Clegg, Celia wife of Thomas Smith Mary  
Ann Townsend James Townsend Joseph Townsend and  
resides in the State of Virginia, Thomas Townsend and  
Samuel Townsend who resided in the State of Tennessee all  
of whom are children of said testator deceased sister, Jane  
Townsend who died in the life time of said testator all of  
said next of kin are twenty one years of age except said  
Park Townsend who is under that age By said will Your  
Petitioners are made executors thereof Petitioners pray that  
Citation may issue to each of said next of kin an ex-  
ecution within this State requiring them to appear and  
show cause why said paper writing should not be stated  
as the last will and testament of Edmund Townsend and  
that a guardian ad litem may be appointed for said Park  
Townsend, That said subscribing witnesses be summoned

to appear, and that said paper writing be admitted to probate as and for the last will and testament of said Edmund Townsend deceased.

It is further ordered that Robert H. Wilson who consents to and accepts the same be appointed guardian ad litem for Park Townsend infant son of Park Townsend deceased.

In the Matter of the Probate of the last will & Testament of Edmund Townsend the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1853 Charles H. Patten John E. Townsend and Edmund L. Townsend having on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1853 made application in this Court for probate of a paper writing as the last will and testament of Edmund

Townsend late of said County of Madison deceased which bears date 25 January 1853 and is filed in this Court and it being shown to the satisfaction of the Court that the following persons who are heirs at law, and of the next of kin of said decedent being children of his deceased sister Lucy Townsend namely Elizabeth wife of Charles Townsend, Sam wife of Upton Brown Ruth wife of John Brown Clara wife of Thomas Smith Mary Ann Townsend, Edmund Townsend Joseph Townsend, Thomas Townsend and George Townsend and are and beyond the limits of the State of Alabama. It is further ordered by the Court that publication be made for three successive weeks in the Southern Advocate a newspaper printed in the Town of Huntsville the first insertion to be made within ten days from the date of this order NOTIFY said non resident heirs of said Edmund Townsend deceased, that the aforesaid application for the probate of said paper writing as the last will and testament of said decedent will be heard at the time of this Court to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in June next, It is further ordered that an alias citation be issued against Henrietta Johnson that the cause be continued to the next regular term of this Court.

Lawrence Townsend Johnson, Samuel C Townsend and Benj  
min F Townsend, their attorney who on approv<sup>e</sup> of by  
the Court having entered into bond in the sum aforesaid  
Condeatained as aforesaid and taken the oaths prescrib<sup>e</sup>d by law  
It is ordered by the Court that letters testamentary be issued  
them accordingly and that said petition be filed and  
Recorded

Will - Know all men by these presents that I Edm<sup>d</sup> Townsend  
of the County of Marion & State of Alabama, being at this  
time in good health and of sound mind, do make this my last  
Will and Testament. I first request to be decently buried and  
then Request that all my just debts should be paid  
I then give unto my brother Samuel Townsend Five thousand  
dollars and unto my Nephew John C. Townsend, Ten thousand  
dollars, I also give unto my Nephew Montford R Townsend  
Five thousand dollars also unto Samuel C Townsend Five  
thousand dollars & also to Parker Townsend Five thousand  
I also give unto my relative Edmund G Townsend Five thousand  
dollars. I also give unto my Nephew Robert Johnson  
Five thousand dollars, I also give unto my Nephew Thomas  
Townsend five thousand dollars. I also leave to my Execut<sup>r</sup>s  
Ten thousand dollars for the benefit of two yellow boys  
Somestead & Woodson. My request is that my executors  
shall petition the Legislature of State to grant them boys  
their freedom and permit them to remain in the state  
I request that all the above legacies shall be paid out of  
what<sup>s</sup> ever I have left me I further give unto Elizabeth Townsend  
and Virginia Townsend all of the Land, negroes stock  
Plantations tools house helds and kitchen furniture  
that belongs to me and all money that may be due  
me after paying the above legacies, and also wish my  
Executors shall keep up all of my plantations as they  
are now kept up for the benefit of the two girls and  
their children after them, I also want my Executors to  
petition to the legislator of the state to let them

few and to admit them to remain in the state and enjoy the benefit  
of their property as I have every reason to believe that they are my  
own children. I further request my Negro man had to remain  
with his family and be as a free man and attend to business  
as he has done for many years under pay of One hundred dollars  
per year, I highly nominate and appoint Chester Bottom, John  
E Townsend & Samuel Townsend & Edm<sup>d</sup> Townsend Executors  
to this my last Will & Testament as witness my hand & seal  
the 25<sup>th</sup> January 1853
