

David J Buchanan's last Will & Testament  
I David J Buchanan, do make and publish this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking and making Void all other Wills by me at any time made.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my Executor.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my two sisters Amanda & M. and M. in equal parts, the Bed Cloths, quilts Sheet &c which I received from my mother, also the Camphor Wood Mug Chest which I received from my brother James and my Clock.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy my small table Table Ware and Cooking Utencials.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to Martha Eastman my large peat.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to John Webb, Doctor, the travel uniform which I received from my brother James also my sword Capt Sash &c.

Sixthly I give and bequeath to James Maffitt my nephew, all my Books.

Seventhly I give and bequeath to William Maffitt all such as he will accept of my Wearing apparel.

Eighthly I give and bequeath to Alfred Smith my Horseum saddle & shot gun.

Ninthly I give and bequeath to Amanda Beckinsall the large Silver Miss Spoon which I received from my brother James.

Tenthly I give and bequeath to my two sisters Amanda & M. and M. in equal parts of my father's estate may be coming to me from his administrator also whatever portion of my grandfather Robert Buchanan's estate may be coming to me from any source whatever, I also give and bequeath to them what ever amount of pay pension bounty or prize money or any money what ever that may be coming to me by reason of my brother James Buchanan's services in the naval or marine services of the United States the whole as well as the bequests to them in the second clause to be held by them and their heirs of this body. Eleventhly and should either of my said sisters

die without heirs of the body the survivor to have all, and should both die without heirs of the body than I give, and bequeath all that I have herein given to them, to my friend and relation Alfred Smith.

Eleventhly whatever of my property may be left after the payment of my debts not being specially bequeathed, I direct to be sold and the proceeds paid over to my beloved wife for her own use and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Alfred Smith my Executor. I witness whereof I do to this my Will let my hand and seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of October 1853.

Last Will & Testament of William G Hamilton test  
I William G. Hamilton do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making Void all Wills by me at any time made.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my Executor.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my Nephew & niece William Joseph Hamilton, and Mary Elizabeth Hamilton herself and Hamilton, and Elizabeth J. Blacker all of my moneys Notes and accounts and personal property to be equally divided between the above named heirs, when the first one comes of age or marry, and the other shall to be retained by my Executor till the other becomes of age or marry.

Thirdly I direct that my saddle horse and all my furniture to be sold to the highest bidder on a credit of twelve months and that my somme moneys etc, be kept by my Executor for the use and benefit of the above named heirs.

Fourthly, I direct that my Executor take my Negro or Negress in to his hands and keep them as he may think best for the two above named heirs as soon as I am dead.
