

Item 5th In the event any of my Children should die before the division or distribution of the property in my Will, should such deceased Child or Children ~~then surviving~~ leave any Child or Children surviving such Child or Children then surviving shall be entitled to the interest of the deceased parent under the Will.

Item 6th I bequeath to my son E. S. Wilson the portrait of myself and the portrait of my wife

Item 7th I bequeath to my son James L. Wilson the portrait of his second father James Leatherman

Item 8th It is my desire that my son E. S. Wilson shall live with his Mother upon such terms as they shall agree, that his Mother may have the benefit of his society and protection. But this is intended only in the expression of a desire and not as a disposition of my right or property.

Item 9th I hereby nominate and appoint my sons, John L. Wilson James L. Wilson and E. S. Wilson Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal. *Bened Wilson*
