3rd I will to my beloved wife Nancy George all my house hold and Kitchen furniture and such of my other property of (a perishable nature) as she may deem necessary for her support and comfort through life and any portion of my estate that she may think proper to be sold after my decease it is my will that the proceeds thereof it shall be applied first to the payment of my funeral expenses all my just debts by my executors hereinafter mentioned

The remainder of any thing to be kept as a fund for the support and comfort of her during her natural life under the guardianship and protection of my beloved sons William P. George and James N. George it also my will that my beloved wife Nancy George have the use and benefit enjoyment of all my real estate during her natural life unless the care and management of her two sons above named, 4th I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved sons William P. George and James N. George my executors to this my last will and testament given under my hand and seal this 27th day of June 1834

I hereby give and bequeath to him also all the interest I have or may have at the time of my death in the Slave Stephen, John Mary Francis & Jacob (now in the possession of mine William S. Pop) and to him I also give and bequeath all the interest I may have in the California Company of which I am a member whether it be in Capital stock or in profits which may accrue and to which I may be entitled at the time of my death.

I hereby nominate and appoint Col. James Sutton Executor of this my last will and testament.
