make this my last will and testament

I wish my body devoutly buried I wd I will and bequeath
to my dear beloved wife Mary & her the tract of Land on
which I now live containing about 230 Acres called the home
place she is to have the said Land during her natural life
Shewnd she may again thin and in that case I wish the Land
and the profits to be equally divided between her and
my children to wit, Eliza & Mary James & Mary Anne & Mary
Eliza & Mary

I wish the trail of Hans called the bronson place to be Salu which
contains about 6's Area On a Credit of 1243 years

I wish also the Russian trade of Camel Salt also on a Credit of 1289 years Salt trade containing seventy eight years.

5th I wish all of the personal property save with the
exceptions of a small mare & cott & yellow catt & one
small filly all of which I will and bequeath unto my
wife Mary C. Gray also I wish her to have one pair
of Oxen three milk Cows and about 25 or 30 head of
~~stock~~ hogs also I wish her to have all the household
kitchen furniture together with three plow stocks
& six plows I wish also my wife to have about 2500th
Dollars all the what that is now on hand and the sum
also I wish her to have ^{some} 25 head of Sheep and
her Little Laddie

6th I wish all and every one of my Just to be paid
I also appaint John H. Taylor my executor to this
my last will and testament and here it is distinctly
understood that I wish my executor proceed to
execute this will without any order of Court
In witness whereof I have hereunto Set
my hand and Seal this 12 day of June

John Mottow, Last Will

I have all men by these presents that John Matthews do make and publish this as my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me at any time made

Firstly I will and bequeath that all of my just debts be paid out of the first money that comes into the hands of my Representatives. Secondly That all of my property, it both Land and negroes. be sold as soon as practicable on a credit of Twelve months. Thirdly That my Land and negroes be sold the first of November next the Land on a credit of one two three years the negroes on a credit of Twelve months.

Lawfully that my representatives sell the land in one or two lots as they see proper.

Fifthly, that my son William have three hundred
dollars to complete his schooling also that my
daughter Lucinda have two hundred and
fifty dollars for the same purpose, also that
my daughter Mary D. C. have three hundred dollars for
the same purpose, Sixthly, That all the balance of

the same purpose, Sixthly That all the balance of my effects be equally divided between all of my children to wit, Charles W. John P. Nancy & Caroline S. Quise

to Nancy & to be set alone to her and her mother
lawful I knew Seventy that my son John I have sent
you all the land west of the Public and north of the house
house for the next year Eighth that my representatives
be empowered to make a deed to one acre of land for the
purchase of Lembae & cadbury
