 I know all men by these presents that this
 is my last will & testament all others
 void. I will that after my death as soon as any Monies come
 into the hands of my Executors that all my just debts
 be paid.
 I give to my beloved wife my home tract of land containing
 about Ninety Acres all of which lies West of the big
 Road leading from Huntsville to Fayetteville with the
 exception of five acres around the Spring and all the
 Household and Kitchen furniture and one third of the
 proceeds of all of the lands ^{that} I have sold by my Executors
 I give to my beloved son George W. Webb a certain tract
 of land commencing at a Hickory Corner in Greer's
 line, running South with Colo. Sutton's line to a Poplar
 thence due West to a Post Oak, thence West to Lewis
 and Webb's line to three Log-woods, thence North with
 his line to a Hickory corner, thence East past a Pole
 thence North to the big Road corner on a large White
 Oak in the edge of the Orchard, thence North to the
 Green line, thence East to the beginning.
 I give unto my beloved daughter Nancy Benton a certain
 piece of land commencing at a corner tree in Morgan's
 line, thence South to a dogwood, thence West to a White
 Oak, thence South with Morgan's line to a Post Oak
 thence West to a Hickory corner, thence
 South with his line to a Hickory corner, thence East and
 North far enough to make a hundred Acres and thence
 West to the beginning.
 I give to my ^{beloved} daughter Lucillea Torry commencing at a
 certain Chestnut corner of my Owsley tract of land
 thence South to a ~~corner~~ on Sigden Harper's line, thence
 West to a Chestnut corner, thence West to a White Oak,
 thence North to a White Oak, thence ^{West} to a White
 Oak, thence West to a White Oak, thence West to a Stake
 3 poles, thence North 6 poles to a Beach, thence ^{10 poles} 22 poles to a
 Stake, thence North 48 poles to a Sweet Gum, thence West 40
 poles to a dogwood, thence North 40 poles to a Stake
 thence East 40 poles to a Chestnut, thence East to his line
 on the Owsley tract thence North to a Hickory, thence East
 to a Post Oak and black Gum, thence North & East to the beginning

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 Sixthly I give to my beloved son Robert Webb a certain piece
 of land beginning at a Black Oak his own corner, thence
 South and East to Sutton's corner, thence to R. L. Webb's cor-
 ner, on a long Chestnut stump, thence North and along
 the Huntsville Road to R. L. Webb's corner on a black Oak
 thence West with his line to the beginning.
 I give to my ^{beloved} Grand-son James L. Benton a certain piece of
 land commencing at a Poplar corner, thence South to a long
 Poplar corner, thence South and West to Benton's line, and
 with Benton's line to a small Chestnut corner, Benton's
 corner, thence North to the beginning.
 I give unto my beloved Grand-son Chapman Webb a
 certain piece of land commencing at a Black Oak corner
 of Thomas Polk thence West 80 poles to a Poplar on Polk's
 line, thence South 100 to a long Poplar, thence East 80
 poles to a black Oak, R. L. Webb's corner, thence North with
 his line to a small black Oak, thence East and North to
 the beginning.
 I wish all the remainder of my land to be laid off by my
 Executors to suit purchasers and sold and the proceeds
 equally divided between my Children and the proceeds of all
 my property divided the same way.
 I nominate and appoint James Benton George Webb and
 J. L. Thomsen my Executors - Witness my hand and seal
 this 20th day of June 1854
