

86 The Last Will & Testament of George Cunningham Esq

George Cunningham being of sound mind and disposing memory though feeble in health do make & publish this my last Will & Testament

Item 1st It is my will that my funeral expenses together with my Just debts be paid out of the first money.

Item 2nd I give to my wife Permilia A. Cunningham all of my household & kitchen furniture together with one cow & calf. Item 3rd It is my will that my House & Lot in the town of Fayetteville be sold by my executor on a credit of one or two years and out of the proceeds when due and collected I give to my wife Permilia A. Cunningham during her natural life and at her death to my daughter Louisa Virginia Cunningham.

Item 3rd I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Permilia A. my Land on Mulberry Creek during her natural life & at her death to my daughter Louise Virginia Cunningham.

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my wife Permilia A. my negro woman Rachel during her natural life and at her death to my daughter Louisa Virginia Cunningham. It is my will that my personally of every description not heretofore bequeathed be sold by my executor and the proceeds when collected be given to my wife during her natural life & then to my daughter Louisa Virginia.

Item 5th I nominate and appoint Peter Cunningham, son my sole executor of this my last will and if consistent with Law of Tennessee I appoint him guardian testamentary of my daughter Louisa Virginia.

Item 6th It is my will that all the property both real & personal bequeathed to my daughter Louisa Virginia Cunningham is given to her during her life and at her death

87 to the heirs of her body & in the event she should leave no issue said property is to go to the next of kin.

The Last Will and Testament of Hugh R. Hamilton Esq

of Tennessee being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make & publish this my last will and testament as follows

1st It is my will that my crop and as much of my perishable property as may be necessary to defray my funeral expenses and to pay off all my Just debts be sold and the proceeds applied to the use,

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary my tract of Land on which I live, my negro girl Mariab and all the other property I own during her natural life or widowhood and at her death I wish my property to be equally divided between my seven children & viz Susan C. William G. James H. Nancy Ann, Robert B. Samuel M. and the infant son who has no name and if my wife Mary should at any time intermarry with any other person it is my will that my property be sold and the proceeds be equally divided between my wife Mary and my above named children.

Lastly I constitute and appoint Peter R. Hamilton & William G. Zimmerman my executors to this my last will and testament signed sealed and published in presence of us
