The Last Will and Testament of Richard Curnel deceased September the seventeenth one thousand eighteen hundred and fifty five in the name of God a men

I Richard Curnel being in a low state of health though of sound mind I do make and publish this as my last will and testament.

The first I recommend my soul to that god I gave it

I direct that my funeral expenses and all of my just debts as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may die possessed of or may first come in to the hands of my executor.

Item 3 I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Curnel all of my lands I now live on, and all of the lands may be coming to me for my services in the war of Eighteen hundred and twelve and all of my stock of all kinds with the farming tools and all of my household and kitchen furniture all of the above named property that I have bequeath unto my beloved wife to do as she pleases with and at her death the same way lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Curnel my Executor in witness whereof I do to this my Will set my hand and seal the day and date above written

The Last will and testament of Hannah Erdens
of Hannah Erdens of Lincoln having suffered long infirmities of body but of sound mind to make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.

First I direct that after my death all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of any money that may come into the hands of my executors

Secondly I direct that my grave and the graves and my Brothers near the cross roads in the County of Madison State of Alabama be enclosed with a stone wall the expenses of which to be paid out of my Estate

Thirdly I give and bequeath and direct to my niece Ann He Drake the following property to wit the slaves Neal Ned Jim Addison Frank Jack Harry William Henry Davy Little Neal Blaine Martha Anna Rebecca Morris Rachell Diggy Esmaeline Mary Martha Caroline Matilda Margaret Ann Rose and the present and future increase of the above mentioned

Sen. all slaves the tract of Land or which I now live with all the appurtenances my house hold and Kitchen furniture black livery and his horses mules and Land Stock of every description whatsoever

The above named property together with any others which may herein after be left to or for the benefit of the said Ann He Drake is to be held by her son George Ell Moody in trust for her separate use and benefit during the continuance of the said Ann He Drake with such her present Husband Col Samuel Drake so that he shall in no wise no manner whatever have the benefit of any of it, to be used managed and disposed of by the said George as she shall direct

Moreover by writing in the margin of a last will & testament or otherwise it being my object to give her also full control over it best not in such manner that said Drake shall ever have the benefit of any of it. The said Covenants of the said Ann He Drake with her present Husband ever cease in his lifetime than the trust created in this item is to cease and the said Ann is to hold the property herein obtained

and bequeathed to her absolutely and in fee simple,
Should the said Ann H. Drake die before the Courtship with
said Drake shall otherwise determine And without making
a Will or writing in the nature of a Will or shall the
said Ann die before I do then I give bequeath and
devise the property real and personal herein bequeathed
and devised to her or for her benefit or so much of
it as may be left to her four children George E.
Moody Dorinda Ann A. McRae Marcellus Drake
and Adalide Drake to be equally divided between
them and the portion intended for the said Dorinda
to be held by the said George E. Moody in trust forth
from use and benefit of the said Dorinda during her
Courtship with her present Husband A. McRae
to be used managed and disposed of by the said
George E. Moody as she shall direct but out in
such manner that the said A. McRae shall
desire any right or exercise any control over
it But shall the Courtship of the said
Dorinda with the said A. McRae cease during
the lifetime of the said Dorinda then the trust
in relation to the property intended for her is to
be likewise to cease And she is to hold it as an
absolute and in fee simple In case of her death
before the determination of her Courtship with A.
McRae otherwise and without disposing
of property herein left to her either by writing in
the nature of a Will or otherwise as above she is directed
to do then I wish the property designed for her
benefit or so much of it as may be left to be
divided equally between her children in the same
way as if they were a single sole and had died
intestate Then of the property or any portion it
herself bequeathed or devised to the said Ann
or Dorinda be sold and other property in its
stead then the property purchased to be subject
to all the trusts and conditions annexed to the
property sold
However I give and bequeath to Matilda
McKinney of Limestone County Alabama

One thousand Dollars in Money And Two beds and Bedding
not subject to the debts of his husband nor to be managed nor
contrived by him in any way whatever

Fifthly I give and bequeath to Abraham Eddins one thousand
Dollars and to his wife Clara Eddins five hundred
Dollars

Sixthly I give and bequeath to Pachina Elliott Eight
hundred Dollars

Seventh I give and bequeath to Thomas Anderson
Eight hundred Dollars

Eighth After the payment of the money legacies herein contained
I leave all my bonds and accounts, and if
they all should not be sufficient they must be
proportionately They may be paid off in bonds or
accounts which may be deemed good within twelve
months after my death

Ninthly after the satisfaction of the foregoing Legacies

I give And bequeath And leave all the rest and
subsidiary of my estate real and personal of every description
whatever with all the crops in every description to the
said Ann H. Drake to be held and disposed of in
the same way in all respects whatever as the property
specifically bequeathed to her in the first item
of this will

Such as the said Ann H. Drake resides in another state
and at a great distance from the other Legatees

I desire that her legacy be paid her immediately
after my death

Tenthly I appoint my niece Ann H. Drake her
executrix of this my last will and testament
provided that said Samuel Drake is to have nothing to
do according to law with my estate And shall be
thoroughly qualified as such I do not wish any
discrepancy to be required of her
