2nd I bequeath to my Daughter Mary H. Mrs. B. Hamilton one side saddle two bonil Lamb
3rd I will to my Daughter Martha R. one Bed and furniture and one side saddle.

4th I will to my Son Samuel H. Bay flour and saree

5th I will to my Daughter Hannah B. one Bed and furniture and one side saddle worth \$18.00 or its equivalent

6th I will to my Son Henry B. one Clay Bank Mone and saddle

7th I will to my other 3 Daughters namely Katherine H., Sarah A. H. and Lucinda Jane, one bed and furniture each.

8th All the rest of my property I will to my wife H. H. during her life time or widow hood, at the termination of either her life time or my land to be equally divided between my Sons Charles B. Smith and Henry B. and that ^{they} support my Mother her life time, and also that all my daughters have their boarding off the farm during the time they are single or live on the farm and that my Sons bear an equal proportion of their boarding

9th I will that all my other property be equally divided among all my above named Children — I wish my to be my administrator let each one of my Sons choose a person to divide the land for him — To my Children I have tried to ^{do} Justice to you all, Union and Union
