

Fifthly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Seate, one negro boy named George on horse and saddle to be worth as much as the horse and saddle that I give to Angelina Arlifter Brunt one bed & furniture —

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my son John Seate my daughter Arlifter Brunt & Anna Seate on sideboard Cupboard and Bureau at the death of my wife to be equally divided amongst them and the one taken the sideboard shall pay the other two seven dollars each

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my grand son Eli McGehee and my grand daughter Horona McGehee being the living him of my daughter Anna McGehee seven dollars each it being the balance of the portion I intended her.

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Seate five dollars

Ninthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Seate one bed and furniture at the death of my wife Margaret Seate

Tenthly my will and desire that after the death of my wife that my daughter Arreuna Seate shall have twenty five dollars out of the value of the four negros that is to say Reuch Peggy Lewis and Morgan and then to be equally divided between my son John Seate my daughters Angelina Arlifter Brunt and Anna Seate according to valuation.

Eleventhly I give and bequeath to my daughters Mary Seate, Sarah Wilson, Nancy Seate, Angelina Arlifter Brunt, and Arreuna Seate, and my son John Seate all the remainder after the death of my wife Margaret Seate consisting of stock of all kinds, farming tools, house hold and kitchen furniture stills & tubs to be sold & divided equally amongst them

I do hereby nominate and appoint Andrew Lane of this county Tenn. my executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I do to this my will set my hand & seal this day of 1843

Jacob Hamilton's Last Will

Tennessee Lincoln County. In the name of God Amen I Jacob Hamilton of the County and State aforesaid knowing that it appointed unto man once to die, being weak in body but of sound mind, do make this my last will in words, manner and form, 'to wit' First of all I give my soul to God who gave it, to me and my body to my Executors, (whom I shall herein after appoint), to be buried in a Christian like manner. And as touching such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I will & bequeath in the following manner.

Item 1st my will and desire is that my just and lawful debts should be paid out of my Estate

Item 2nd my will and desire is that my wife Elizabeth Hamilton shall have my tract of land, where I now live containing four hundred & fifteen acres be the same more or less, with all my house hold & kitchen furniture farming utensils as much stock of every description, that I am possessed of as may be sufficient for her and her family and further she is to have choice of two of my negros. All which is to have during her natural life or Widow hood, then it is to return to the estate and be sold on twelve months credit and divided among my children so as to make them all equal, and my wife provided she should marry, further my will and desire is that my wife have all the money and effects which may come from her fathers estate to dispose off as she pleases

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my son Esley Hamilton One hundred acres of land more or less, estimated at five hundred dollars, which is to be rendered in upon a division of my estate

Item 4th I will & bequeath to my son Jasper S. Hamilton One hundred acres of land more or less which he has in possession estimated at five hundred dollars, which is to be rendered in upon a division of my estate

Item 5th I will and bequeath to my son Ezekiel Wilson Hamilton One hundred acres of land more or less which he has in possession estimated at five hundred dollars which is to be rendered in upon a division of my estate

Item 6th I Will and bequeath to my son Alexander Hamilton One Negro boy by the name of Calvin estimated at One thousand dollars, five hundred dollars of which he is to pay me for which I have his note. the other five hundred he is to render in upon a division of my estate

Item 7th I Will and bequeath to my son Newton A. L. Hamilton One hundred acres of land, more or less with timber and for a house seat which he has in possession estimated at Six hundred dollars to be rendered in upon a division of my estate

Item 8th my will and desire is that at my decease all my my negroes besides the two my wife may choose be put up and sold to the highest bidder on a twelve months credit and all my surplus stock if there be any, and the proceeds of said sale be divided equally among my children that one of age or married and have not had any thing (namely) Sarah, Jane, Lory Luanda, Evalene, and Nancy.

Item 9th I will and bequeath to my daughter Jane two hundred dollars which has descended to her by her grand mother Jane Brown which is to be paid her of my estate over and her equal part of my estate

Item 10th My will and desire is that my minor children have a horse and saddle and bed and furniture as they become of age or marry, out of my estate, namely Mary, Emily, Thomas, James S. & Lucetta 13.

Item 11th I finally constitute and appoint my son-in-law William Walker & My son Alexander Hamilton my sole Executors to this my last Will & Testament

Temple Taylor's Will

I Temple Taylor of the County of Lincoln and State of Kansas do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me made at any time

1st I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may be possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executor

2nd I bequeath to my wife Jane Taylor the land on which I now reside containing 80 acres with all my stock house hold and kitchen furniture that is not otherwise disposed of during her lifetime or widowhood at her decease the land and what remains to be sold and equally divided between my children William G. Taylor Henry C. Taylor James A. S. Alexander Milly Susan Alexander, Cynthia Shotton Elizabeth Shotton Emma Martin Taylor.

3rd I bequeath at my decease to my son Henry Taylor 200 acres in a square of the east end the tract of land on which he now lives, the remainder of said tract 289 acres to equally divide between my sons William Taylor and James A. S. Alexander

4th I bequeath to my daughter Milly S. Alexander One Cow & calf Cow named Stormie and one bed & furniture

5th I bequeath to my son William Taylor One bay mare named Fier and One Cow & calf and sow & pigs being the same which he claims

6th I bequeath to my son Henry ^{the money which} he now has on a loan All my notes and accounts to be collected and if after paying of all my debts to be given to my wife to support my family

7th Well as long as Jane Scott chooses to live with my family as she has done hitherto that she has the privilege Lastly I do nominate and appoint Young J. Taylor my executor in witness whereof I do this my will at my hand and seal this the 13th day of December 1851
